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REVIEW OF AB 2300 REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

Local governments with Marks-Roos activity must file certain information with the California Debt and Investment Advisory Commission (CDIAC). Among the information, local governments generally must forward the Commission copies of their public hearing notices and resolutions of intent to issue Marks-Roos debt. However, the law provides for several exemptions from these forwarding requirements, depending on the type of project being financed. In 2007, local governments issued 144 notices and resolutions, but all of them were exempt. In this article, CDIAC staff detail the filings and describe the nature of the exemptions.

Background. Under Chapter 723, Statutes of 2001 (AB 2300, Florez), CDIAC and the State Attorney General's Office have been required to collect copies of public hearing notices and resolutions of intent to issue debt for certain bond issuances under the Marks-Roos Local Bond Pooling Act of 1985 (see text box for background information on AB 2300) since January 1, 2001. The local agencies that are required to provide hearing notices and resolutions of intent are those that do not meet the exemption requirements under Government Code 6586.5 and 6586.7.

CDIAC AB 2300 Collection Update. In 2007, CDIAC received 144 Reports of Final Sale for Marks-Roos bond issues. After a review of the 144 issues, CDIAC determined that none of those issuers were subject to the filing requirements. Although none of the issuers of Marks-Roos bonds were required to file, two issuers incorrectly submitted public hearing notices and resolutions of intent. The issuers were exempt from filing because the financings were not for capital improvement projects (one bond was issued for short-term interim financing and the other was issued for pension obligation funding).

Table 1 and Table 2 summarize the results of CDIAC's review of these bond issuances. Table 1 summarizes the exemptions

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from filing a public hearing notice with CDIAC; Table 2 summarizes the exemptions from filing a resolution of intent to issue bonds with CDIAC.

Some issuers may not have reported their bonds to CDIAC, although they are required by law to do so 30 days prior to the sale and within 45 days following the sale. CDIAC also received additional filings for hearing notices and resolutions of intent for three bond issues that were not Marks-Roos bonds, and, therefore, did not need to be filed.

A synopsis of Current Events in Public Finance

State of California Issues \$3.2 Billion Economic Recovery Bonds

The State Treasurer's Office issued \$3.2 billion in Economic Recovery Bonds on February 7, 2008. The bond proceeds will be used to restore the reserve for economic uncertainty and avoid a potential cash shortfall projected for March 2008. Governor Schwarzenegger proposed the sale as part of his January budget, and considers the \$3.2 billion part of the solution to the \$14.5 billion deficit. This issuance was for the remaining amount of the Proposition 57 general obligation bond allocation approved by voters in March 2004, which is repaid via a dedicated quarter-cent state sales tax.

2008 California Debt Limit Bond Volume Cap Allocations Announced

The California Debt Limit Allocation Committee (CDLAC) announced its distribution of California's \$3.1 billion federal allocation of private activity bonds for 2008.

CDLAC allocated the majority of the volume cap for 2008, \$2.3 billion (75.1 percent), for housing purposes. The housing allocation consists of \$1.7 billion for multifamily housing and \$610 million for single-family housing. Industrial development programs have been allocated \$120 million; of that total, \$20 million is reserved for small businesses.

Reference Guide on Actuarial Methods Released

onto address heightened interest in government employers' OPEB liabilities, the California Research Bureau (CRB) released Actuarially Speaking: A Plain Language Summary of Actuarial Methods and Practices for Public Employee Pension and Other Post-Employment Benefits (CRB 08-003).

In January 2008, the California Public Employee Post-Employment Benefits Commission issued recommendations to address the costs of providing public employee pension and retiree health benefits. Several of the Commission's recommendations address actuarial practices used to determine funding levels for pension and retiree health benefits. Because actuarial methods are a unique and somewhat complex form of financial accounting, CRB's "plain language" summary was developed to serve as a reference guide for those interested in the topic including policy makers, government employers, pension and health plan administrators and members of the general public.

An actuarial valuation determines how much employers and employees should contribute to the plan during the upcoming valuation period. Included in CRB's report are definitions and explanations of the basic equations used as the foundation for pension plan funding, the components of the actuarial valuation report, the range of factors that affect the funding progress or ratio of the plan, the main elements of actuarial methods and policies, and a sample schedule of funding progress.

MSRB Issues Notice on Bond Insurance Credit Ratings

The Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (MSRB) issued a notice, Bond Insurance Ratings – Application of MSRB Rules (MSRB Notice 2008-04), urging broker-dealers executing trades of insured municipal bonds to review the MSRB's rules on fair-dealing, suitability, fair pricing and confirmation disclosure in the wake of credit rating reviews and downgrades for some bond insurers. The MSRB rule on fair dealing requires a trader to ensure that, before executing a trade with a customer, the trader informs the customer of all material facts. Required disclosure may include information about the credit enhancement applicable to the issue particularly if the issue's credit rating is based on bond insurance and the credit rating of the insurer is under review or has changed. The notice also addresses suitability of dealer-recommended securities based on the customer's objectives, and the effects of changes in ratings (of both the underlying credit and the bond insurer) on the fair pricing of a security.

Standard & Poor's Announces New Measures to Strengthen Operations

Standard & Poor's (S&P) announced new measures to strengthen ratings operations and better serve capital markets. The new actions include establishing an ombudsman, five-year rotation of lead analysts, increasing transparency of its credit rating information and an educational outreach program.

The new measures are in response to losses insurers have suffered from their exposure to mortgage-backed securities. "This initial set of actions is the product of a comprehensive, formal assessment of our policies and practices conducted in collaboration with an independent third-party expert, as well as active dialogue with market participants, regulators, and legislators," said Deven Sharma, S&P president. "Our goal is not only to enhance specific processes but also to minimize even the potential for perceived conflicts of interest and provide the public a greater understanding of how our ratings are determined, what they mean, and how market trends and events affect them."

Hearing Notice Exemption. Under various subsections of Government Code Section 6586.5, local agencies are exempt from filing copies of a hearing notice with CDIAC and the State Attorney General's Office if the bonds are issued:

- Pursuant to the California Community Development Law, Part 1 (commencing with Section 33000) of Division 24 of the California Health and Safety Code;
- To finance transportation facilities and vehicles;
- To finance a facility that is located within the boundaries of an authority, provided that the authority that issues those bonds consists of any of the following:
 - Local agencies with overlapping boundaries;
 - A county and a local agency or local agencies located entirely within that county;
 - A city and a local agency or local agencies located entirely within that city;
- To finance a facility for which an authority has received an allocation from the California Debt Limit Allocation Committee; and
- Of an authority that consists of no less than 100 local agencies and the agreement that established that authority requires the governing body of the local agency that is a member of the authority in whose jurisdiction the facility will be located to approve the facility and the issuance of the bonds.

In addition, as stated in subdivision (c) of Section 6586.5, bonds issued for any of the following purposes are also exempt from the reporting obligations:

- To finance the undergrounding of utility and communication lines;
- To finance, consistent with the provisions of this chapter, facilities for the generation or transmission of electrical energy for public or private uses and all rights, properties, and improvements necessary therefor, including fuel and water facilities and resources;
- To finance facilities for the production, storage, transmission, or treatment of water, recycled water, or wastewater;
- To finance public school facilities; and
- To finance public highways located within the jurisdiction of an authority that is authorized to exercise the powers specified in Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 31100) of Division 17 of the Streets and Highways Code, provided that the authority conducts the noticed public hearing and makes the finding of significant public benefit in accordance with this section.

Resolution of Intent Exemption. Furthermore, Government Code 6586.7 exempts local agencies from filing resolutions of intent to issue bonds under Article 1 of the Marks-Roos Act as well as those issued for the following purposes:

- Specified in subdivision (c) of Section 6586.5;
- Pursuant to the California Community Development Law, Part 1 (commencing with Section 33000) of Division 24 of the California Health and Safety Code;
- To finance transportation facilities and vehicles;
- To finance a facility that is located within the boundaries of an authority, provided that the authority that issues those bonds consists of any of the following:
 - Local agencies with overlapping boundaries;
 - A county and a local agency or local agencies located entirely within that county;
 - A city and a local agency or local agencies located entirely within that city;
- To finance a facility for which an authority has received an allocation from the California Debt Limit Allocation Committee;
- Of an authority that consists of no less than 100 local agencies and the agreement that established that authority requires the governing body of the local agency that is a member of the authority in whose jurisdiction the facility will be located to approve the facility and the issuance of the bonds.

CDIAC encourages issuers to continue to submit *Reports of Proposed Debt Issuance* and *Reports of Final Sale* of Marks-Roos bonds and, when appropriate, to submit public hearing notices and copies of resolutions of intent to issue debt in accordance with AB 2300. Issuers can complete the *Report of Proposed Debt Issuance* and the *Report of Final Sale* on CDIAC's website at **www.treasurer.ca.gov/cdiac/reporting.asp#forms.** Issuers also can obtain the mail-in forms at **www.treasurer.ca.gov/cdiac/reporting_mail.asp** or by calling CDIAC at (916) 653-3269.

CDIAC will continue to track compliance with this statute and will report on its findings in future issues of *DEBT LINE*.

2007-08 STATE LEGISLATIVE SUMMARY

The California State Legislature began the second year of its two-year session on January 7, 2008. The following list contains the 2007-08 bills that may affect state and local bond issuance and public fund investment practices. January 31, 2008 was the last day for each house to pass bills introduced in 2007 in their house, and February 22, 2008 will be the last day for bills to be introduced. The bill summaries below were excerpted from the Legislative Summary provided by the State Legislative Counsel and are current as of February 15, 2008. A definition is provided for Joint Rule 56 in the text box because it is a term used throughout this legislative summary.

Joint Rule 56: Bills introduced in the first year of the regular session and passed by the house of origin on or before the January 31st constitutional deadline are "carryover bills." Immediately after January 31, bills introduced in the first year of the regular session that do not become "carryover bills" shall be returned to the Chief Clerk of the Assembly or Secretary of the Senate, respectively. Notwithstanding Rule 4, as used in this rule "bills" do not include constitutional amendments.

 Under existing law, various bond acts have been approved by the voters to provide funds for water projects, facilities, and programs. This bill would state the intent of the Legislature to enact a comprehensive delta sustainability, water reliability, and water quality general obligation bond act to be submitted for voter approval in an unspecified 2008 election.

Location: Assembly Rules Committee

AB 10 De La Torre Children's Hospital Bond Act of 2008

Existing law establishes the Children's Hospital Bond Act of 2004. This bill would enact the Children's Hospital Bond Act of 2008 which, if adopted by the voters, would authorize, for purposes of financing a specified children's hospital grant program for hospitals that qualified for grants pursuant to the Children's Hospital Bond Act of 2004, the issuance, pursuant to the State General Obligation Bond Law, of bonds in the amount of \$980,000,000. The bill would provide for submission of the bond act to the voters at the next statewide election in accordance with specified law. As the bill contains urgency provisions, it would become law upon the Governor's signature.

Location: Senate Health Committee

AB 100 Mullin Education Facilities: Kindergarten-University Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2008 This bill would state the intent of the Legislature to enact a Kindergarten-University Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2008, to become operative only if approved by the voters at the November 4, 2008, statewide general election, and to provide for the submission of that act to the voters at that election. The bill would state that it also is the intent of the Legislature that a bond act, if approved by the voters at that election, would provide for the issuance of \$9.087 billion of state general obligation bonds to provide aid to school districts, county superintendents of schools, county boards of education, the California Community Colleges, the University of California, the Hastings College of the Law, and the California State University to construct and modernize education facilities.

Location: Assembly Appropriations Committee

AB 677 Nakanishi The Firefighters' Home Purchase Act of 2007

Existing law establishes various programs to provide financial assistance for housing. This bill would enact the Firefighters' Home Purchase Act of 2007, which, if adopted, would authorize the issuance of bonds in an unspecified amount pursuant to the State General Obligation Bond Law for the purpose of providing firefighters with the opportunity to acquire homes in the communities where they provide firefighting services. This bill would provide for the submission of the bond act to the voters at the next statewide election in accordance with specified law.

Location: Assembly Housing and Community Development. Filed with the Chief Clerk pursuant to Joint Rule 56.

AB 1315 Ruskin Bond Funds: Housing and Emergency Shelter Trust Fund Act (Park Projects)

The Housing and Emergency Shelter Trust Fund Act of 2006 authorizes the issuance of bonds in the amount of \$2.85 billion pursuant to the State General Obligation Bond Law. The act makes \$850 million of those bond funds available for, among other things, infill housing development and other related infill development, subject to conditions and criteria that the Legislature may provide in statute. The act also makes \$200 million of those bond funds available for housing-related parks grants in urban, suburban, and rural areas, subject to conditions and criteria that the Legislature.

This bill would provide that, in implementing those provisions, priority shall be given to park projects around transportation hubs and train stations, projects connecting infill development and schools, projects mitigating traffic in school routes, and projects connecting urban areas with open-space parks and trails.

Location: Assembly Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee. Filed with the Chief Clerk pursuant to Joint Rule 56.

SB 2 (2X) Perata Safe Drinking Water Act of 2008

Under existing law, various measures have been approved by the voters to provide funds for water protection, facilities, and programs. This bill would enact the Safe Drinking Water Act of 2008 which, if approved by the voters, would authorize, for the purposes of financing a specified water supply reliability and environmental restoration program, the issuance of bonds in the amount of \$6.835 billion pursuant to the State General Obligation Bond Law. The bill would provide for submission of the bond act to the voters at the February 5, 2008, statewide primary election. As the bill contains urgency provisions, it would become law upon the Governor's signature.

Location: Senate Appropriations Committee

SB 3 (2X) Cogdill Water Supply Reliability Bond Act of 2008

Under existing law, various measures have been approved by the voters to provide funds for water protection, facilities, and programs. This bill would enact the Water Supply Reliability Bond Act of 2008 which, if approved by the voters, would authorize, for the purposes of financing a specified water supply reliability and environmental restoration program, the issuance of bonds in the amount of \$9.085 billion pursuant to the State General Obligation Bond Law. The bill would provide for submission of the bond act to the voters at the November 4, 2008, statewide general election. This bill is similar to SB 1052.

Location: Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee

SB 59 Cogdill Reliable Water Supply Bond Act of 2008

Under existing law, various bond acts have been approved by the voters to provide funds for water projects, facilities, and programs. This bill would enact the Reliable Water Supply Bond Act of 2008 which, if approved by the voters, would authorize, for purposes of financing a water supply program, the issuance, pursuant to the State General Obligation Bond Law, of bonds in the amount of \$3.95 billion. The bill would require the Secretary of State to submit the bond act to the voters at the November 4, 2008, statewide general election.

Location: Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee. Returned to Secretary of Senate pursuant to Joint Rule 56.

SB 156SimitianCalifornia Reading and Literacy Improvement and Public Library Construction and Renovation
Bond Act of 2008

Existing law establishes the California Library Construction and Renovation Bond Act of 1988 and the California Reading and Literacy Improvement and Public Library Construction and Renovation Bond Act of 2000. Existing law authorizes the issuance of bonds, pursuant to the State General Obligation Bond Law, in the amount of \$75 million in the 1988 act and in the amount of \$350 million in the 2000 act, for the purpose of financing library construction and renovation. This bill would enact the California Reading and Literacy Improvement and Public Library Construction and Renovation Bond Act of 2008, for submission to the voters at the 2008 statewide general election. The bill, if

approved by the voters, would authorize the issuance, pursuant to the State General Obligation Bond Law, of bonds in the amount not to exceed a total of \$4 billion for the purpose of financing library construction and renovation pursuant to a program administered by the State Librarian.

Location: Senate Appropriations Committee. Filed with the Chief Clerk pursuant to Joint Rule 56.

SB 310MachadoState Water Resources Development SystemThe Department of Water Resources operates the State Water Resources Development System, commonly referred
to as the State Water Project, in accordance with the California Water Resources Development Bond Act. This bill
would make technical, nonsubstantive changes to a provision that authorizes the issuance of bond funds in the amount
of \$1.75 billion for the purposes of that bond act.

Location: Senate Rules Committee. Returned to Secretary of Senate pursuant to Joint Rule 56.

SB 1052 Perata Water Supply Reliability Bond Act of 2008

Under existing law, various measures have been approved by the voters to provide funds for water protection, facilities, and programs. This bill would enact the Water Supply Reliability Bond Act of 2008 which, if approved by the voters, would authorize, for the purposes of financing a specified water supply reliability and environmental restoration program, the issuance of bonds in the amount of \$5.4 billion pursuant to the State General Obligation Bond Law. The bill would provide for submission of the bond act to the voters at the November 4, 2008, statewide general election. As the bill contains urgency provisions, it would become law upon the Governor's signature. This bill is similar to SB 3(2X).

Location: Senate Rules Committee. Returned to Secretary of Senate pursuant to Joint Rule 56.

SCA 2 Simitian Clean Drinking Water, Water Supply Security, and Environmental Improvement Bond Act of 2007

Existing provisions of the California Constitution prohibit the creation by the Legislature of debts in excess of \$300,000 except for a single object or work specified in a law creating the debt, which is approved by the people by a majority of the votes cast in a statewide general or direct primary election. This measure would establish requirements for the amendment or repeal of a bond measure designated as the "Clean Drinking Water, Water Supply Security, and Environmental Improvement Bond Act of 2007" to be submitted to the voters at an unspecified statewide election. This measure would provide that it would become operative only if the described bond measure is approved by the voters at an unspecified statewide election, and would provide, in that event, that it would become operative commencing on an unspecified date.

Location: Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee

Bond-Related Legislation

AB 169 Levine *Joint Powers Authorities: Indian Tribes* Existing law authorizes two or more public agencies, by agreement, to jointly exercise common powers. Existing law defines public agencies for this purpose. This bill would provide that 16 federally recognized Indian tribal governments may participate in the Southern California Association of Governments, a joint powers authority, for specified purposes and subject to specified conditions in the six-county region of the Southern California Association of Governments.

Location: Senate Local Government Committee

AB 862 Wolk Public Resources: Information

Existing law requires that for any state general obligation bond measure approved by the voters on or after January 1, 2004, the head of the lead state agency administering the bond proceeds annually report certain information to the Legislature and the Department of Finance. Costs of the report may be included in the cost of administering the bond measure unless the bond measure specifically prohibits those expenses. This bill would require that specified

information produced in support of any project receiving funding from any bond measures approved by the voters on or after November 7, 2006, be supplied to a state digital library designated by the State Librarian in a format and with descriptive and identifying information as designed by the State Librarian. Information that is draft or preliminary in nature or that is duplicative of information already available pursuant to certain requirements, as determined by the State Librarian, need not be supplied. The State Librarian would be required to make the information provided available to the public in an indexed and searchable form on an Internet Web site or an analogous successor network. The State Librarian would be required to charge each recipient of the bond funds a fee to pay for the reasonable costs of the services provided. The payment of the fee would be an allowable use of any allocation of funding for any grant, loan, project, plan, or other activity funded by the specified bond measure. The department, agency, commission, or other entity administering any allocation of funding would be required to provide for payment of the amount of the fee to the State Library before making the final payment of a loan or grant to a recipient.

Location: Assembly Appropriations Committee. Filed with the Chief Clerk pursuant to Joint Rule 56.

AB 1272 Arambula General Obligation Bonds: Administration and Oversight

Among other things, this bill would, with respect to bonds issued on or after January 1, 2008, for purposes of infrastructure projects, as defined for purposes of the local assistance program administered by the bank under its provisions, which may be undertaken by local agencies, transfer an amount representing one-half of one percent of the total bond proceeds, not to exceed a total of \$2 million to the Community Technical Assistance Fund established pursuant to the bill. It would continuously appropriate the moneys in the fund to the bank for purposes of the program, according to specified criteria.

The Kindergarten-University Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2006, the Highway Safety, Traffic Reduction, Air Quality, and Port Security Bond Act of 2006, the Disaster Preparedness and Flood Prevention Bond Act of 2006, and the Safe Drinking Water, Water Quality and Supply, Flood Control, River and Coastal Protection Bond Act of 2006, adopted by the voters at the November 7, 2006, statewide general election, authorized the issuance of general obligation bonds for various specified purposes. This bill would require the Bureau of State Audits to conduct periodic audits to ensure that the proceeds of bonds issued pursuant to these acts are awarded in a timely fashion and in a manner consistent with the requirements of the respective act, and that recipients of bond proceeds are using funds in compliance with the applicable provisions of the respective act.

Location: Assembly Appropriations Committee. Filed with the Chief Clerk pursuant to Joint Rule 56.

SB 22 (1X) Battin For-Profit Clinic Facility Financing: Revenue Bonds

Existing law establishes the California Health Facilities Financing Authority and authorizes the authority to issue revenue bonds for the purposes of financing loans to government and nonprofit entities for the purposes of financing health facility construction and other renovations. This bill would amend the act to authorize the authority to issue additional revenue bonds in an unspecified amount for the purpose of providing similar loans for financing construction, as defined, of for-profit clinic facilities, as defined. The bill would establish the For-Profit Clinic Facility Construction Account within the California Health Facilities Financing Authority Fund for deposit of the proceeds from the issuance of these bonds, and would continuously appropriate those funds to the authority for the purposes of this bill.

SB 46

Perata Housing and Emergency Shelter Trust Fund Act of 2006: Regional Planning, Housing, and Infill Incentive Account

The Housing and Emergency Shelter Trust Fund Act of 2006 authorizes the issuance of bonds in the amount of \$2.85 billion pursuant to the State General Obligation Bond Law. Proceeds from the sale of these bonds are required to be used to finance various existing housing programs, capital outlay related to infill development, brownfield cleanup that promotes infill development, and housing-related parks. The act establishes the Housing and Emergency Shelter Trust Fund of 2006 in the State Treasury, requires the sum of \$850 million to be deposited in the Regional Planning, Housing, and Infill Incentive Account, which the act establishes in the fund, and makes the money in the account available, upon appropriation, for infill incentive grants for capital outlay related to infill housing development and other related infill development, and for brownfield cleanup that promotes infill housing development and other

related infill development consistent with regional and local plans, subject to the conditions and criteria that the Legislature may provide in statute.

This bill would establish the Infill Incentive Grant Program of 2007, to require the Department of Housing and Community Development, upon appropriation by the Legislature of the funds in the Regional Planning, Housing, and Infill Incentive Account for certain purposes, to establish and administer a competitive grant program to allocate those funds to selected qualifying infill projects, as defined, for capital outlay related to infill housing development and related infill infrastructure needs. The bill would require the California Pollution Control Financing Authority, upon appropriation by the Legislature of the funds in the Regional Planning, Housing, and Infill Incentive Account for certain additional purposes, to allocate those funds to selected infill projects for the purposes of assessment, remedial planning and reporting, technical assistance, cleanup or remediation of brownfield sites, or related costs.

Location: Senate Rules Committee

SB 47 Perata Transportation Bonds

Proposition 1B, approved by the voters at the November, 2006, general election enacts the Highway Safety, Traffic Reduction, Air Quality, and Port Security Bond Act of 2006, which authorizes the issuance of \$19.925 billion of general obligation bonds for various transportation purposes, including \$1 billion for the State-Local Partnership Program, to be allocated by the California Transportation Commission to eligible transportation projects nominated by transportation agencies, subject to appropriation by the Legislature. Existing law requires a dollar for dollar match of local funds for projects funded with these bond funds. This bill would state the intent of the Legislature to enact provisions governing project eligibility, matching fund requirements, and the application process relative to allocation of bond proceeds to the State-Local Partnership Program.

Location: Senate Rules Committee. Returned to Secretary of Senate pursuant to Joint Rule 56.

SB 188 Negrete McLeod *Public Finance*

Under the Mark-Roos Local Bond Pooling Act of 1985, a joint exercise of powers authority may issue bonds to assist local agencies in financing public capital improvements, working capital, liability, or other insurance needs, or projects whenever there are significant public benefits for taking that action. This bill would specifically authorize a joint powers authority with more than 450 members and public agencies from other states to establish an authority to finance and develop projects outside the state, subject to certain conditions, under its provisions.

Location: Senate Appropriations Committee. Filed with the Chief Clerk pursuant to Joint Rule 56.

SB 784 Torlakson State General Obligation Bond Law: Reports

The State General Obligation Bond Law sets forth the procedures for the issuance and sale of bonds governed by its provisions and for the disbursal of the proceeds of the sale of those bonds. Existing law provides for various oversight and reporting requirements for the expenditure of state funds, including the proceeds of bonds. Among other things, this bill would do the following:

- Establish new reporting and audit provisions applicable to general obligation bonds authorized on or after November 7, 2006, in order to ensure maximum transparency and accountability regarding the expenditure of bond funds.
- Require that each department or agency responsible for implementing a project funded by bond proceeds to
 electronically submit specified information about the plans, progress, and completion of the project to the Department of Finance, the Controller, and the Treasurer.
- Require the Controller and the Treasurer to ensure that the above information is available online in a searchable format accessible through the Treasurer's web site, and updated at least quarterly, in order to enable the public and officials to analyze and compare performance on bond projects by multiple criteria, including, among others, responsible department or agency, county of project location, local government agency, and construction contractor.
- Require the Treasurer to annually prepare and make available online an executive summary of bond project information, including recommendations to the Legislature and responsible departments or agencies.

- Effective July 1, 2008, require the Controller to audit particular bond projects and to annually assign ten auditor positions to conduct these audits. This bill would grant the Controller authority to access and examine any record of any agency, contractor, and other specified parties that relates to the use of bond proceeds. It also would require the Controller, by April 30 of each year, to prepare an audit plan for the following fiscal year.
- Location: Assembly Appropriations Committee
- SCA 6 McClintock *General Obligation Bonds: Proceeds of Sale* This measure would require that the proceeds from the sale of any general obligation bond that, on or after January 1, 2009, is approved by the voters for issuance pursuant to these provisions be expended only for the costs of construction or acquisition of tangible physical property that has an expected useful life at least equal to the length of time in which the bonds that are sold to finance that construction or acquisition will reach maturity.
 - Location: Senate Governmental Organization Committee

SCA 8 Harman Appropriations Limit

Among other things, this bill would prohibit the state from incurring general obligation bond debt greater than the total amount of state bond debt in existence when this measure becomes operative. This limit would be adjusted annually to account for changes in population and the cost of living. This measure also would prohibit bond brokers from recovering their expenses from a campaign waged in support of the bond measure through their fees and commissions on the sale of the bonds from that bond measure.

Location: Senate Budget and Fiscal Review Committee

Investment-Related Legislation

- ACR 79 Anderson University of California: Divestment from Iran This measure would call upon the University of California to divest from foreign companies with business activities in the Islamic Republic of Iran.
 - Location: Assembly Higher Education Committee

SB 1124 Committee on Local Government Local Government Omnibus Act of 2008

Each year, local officials discover problems with the state statutes that affect counties, cities, special districts, and redevelopment agencies, as well as the laws on land use planning and development. These minor problems do not warrant separate (and expensive) bills. The Senate Local Government Committee responds by combining several of these minor topics into an annual "omnibus bill." Therefore, in addition to the change below, this bill includes other provisions.

Existing law requires local governments to provide annual statements of investment policies, and quarterly investment reports to the California Debt and Investment Advisory Commission, as specified. This bill would repeal that requirement. Existing law, until December 31, 2009, authorizes special districts to issue securitized limited obligation notes, as specified. This bill would extend that authorization to December 31, 2014.

Location: Senate Local Government Committee

SELECTED REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

Under existing law (California Government Code Section 8855(k)), "The issuer of any proposed new debt issue of State or local government (or public benefit corporation incorporated for the purpose of acquiring student loans) shall, not later than 30 days prior to the sale of any debt issue at public or private sale, give written notice of the proposed sale to the Commission, by mail, postage prepaid."

Under California Government Code Section 8855(I), "The issuer of any new debt issue of State or local government (or public benefit corporation for the purpose of acquiring student loans) shall, not later than 45 days after the signing of the bond purchase contract in a negotiated or private financing, or after the acceptance of a bid in a competitive offering, submit a report of final sale to the commission by mail, postage prepaid, or by any other method approved by the commission. A copy of the official statement for the issue shall accompany the report of final sale. The Commission may require information to be submitted in the report of final sale that is considered appropriate."

Under California Government Code Section 53583(c)(2)(B) if a "local agency determines to sell the (refunding) bonds at private sale or on a negotiated sale basis, the local agency shall send a written statement, within two weeks after the bonds are sold, to the California Debt and Investment Advisory Commission explaining the reasons why the local agency determined to sell the bonds at private sale or on a negotiated sale basis instead of at public sale."
