

CALIFORNIA PUBLIC DEBT ISSUANCE, MARCH (IN MILLIONS)1




STATE* VERSUS LOCAL DEBT ISSUANCE, MARCH (IN MILLIONS)1







California state and local agencies issued approximately \$61.4 billion of long-term and short-term debt in calendar year 2014 – a 5.5 percent decrease from 2013. This was in contrast to a slight increase reported in issuance nationwide.²

BOND COUNSELS

When measured by number of deals, Best Best & Krieger (BBK) was California's leading bond counsel firm in 2014, as it was in 2013. BBK's edge over other firms can be attributed to its continued role as bond counsel to two local public agencies in the issuance of bonds under the Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) Program.3 PACE allows a local public agency to issue loans to individual property owners for the purpose of energy efficiency improvements. While the principal amounts are low, the structure of the transactions translates into hundreds of debt issuance reports submitted to CDIAC. BBK was responsible for 30.3 percent of deals that used a bond counsel. Jones Hall placed second with 15.8 percent of the deals. Orrick Herrington & Sutcliffe, Stradling Yocca Carlson & Rauth, and Quint & Thimmig rounded out the top five firms in 2014 on a deal basis. These same five firms occupied the top five rankings in 2013 (Figure 1).

Ranking of bond counsel firms by par amount issued produced an entirely different result. Orrick was by far the leading firm in California. In fact, deals on which Orrick was bond counsel accounted for over \$28 billion – almost twice the amount of the remaining top five firms combined. Stradling Yocca Carlson & Rauth and

Jones Hall finished second and third, respectively. BBK dropped back to ninth based on par value.

Bond counsels participated in 98.6 percent of deals in California during 2014, a slight decrease from the 99.1 percent during 2013.

FINANCIAL ADVISORS

California's top financial advisory firm in 2014, based on deal count, was The PFM Group/Public Financial Management, Inc. (PFM). PFM held on to the top spot in 2014 by participating in 561 deals, a significant increase from the 302 deals they participated in during 2013. PFM acts as financial advisor on the PACE financings, which constitute 83% of deals in which they participate. Fieldman, Rolapp & Associates; Isom Advisors/Urban Futures; Keygent Advisors and KNN Public Finance (KNN) rounded out the top five financial advisory firms on a deal basis for 2014. (Figure 2)

When measured by par amount issued, Public Resources Advisory Group (PRAG) was California's top financial advisory firm in 2014, participating in 35 deals with a total par amount of \$10.6 billion. PFM, Montague DeRose & Associates, KNN, and Fieldman Rolapp complete the top five on a par amount basis.

Based on number of deals, financial advisors participated in 80.3 percent of public debt issuance during 2014, an increase of 5.8 percent from 2013. Based upon par amount issued, financial advisory firms participated in ninety-two percent of the

debt issued in calendar year 2014. This represented an eleven percent increase over 2013.

UNDERWRITERS

Stifel Nicolaus & Company, Inc. with 202 deals, and Piper Jaffray & Co. with 76 deals were California's top two underwriting firms in 2014, as measured by number of deals. These firms maintained their rankings from 2013. The third ranking underwriter of 2013, E.J. De La Rosa & Co., does not appear in the 2014 rankings due to the firm's ac-

quisition by Stifel Nicolaus in April of 2014. The acquisition was a contributing factor to increase in the number of deals underwritten by Stifel from 169 in 2013 to 202 in 2014. (Figure 3)

Morgan Stanley & Co. eclipsed all other underwriting firms on a par value basis by purchasing 16 percent of California's deals involving an underwriter. These deals, 58 in total, represented a par value of approximately \$8.5 billion.

During 2014, underwriters purchased approximately 86 percent of

the state's municipal offerings by par amount.⁴ No participation by an underwriter was reported on 1,050 deals totaling approximately \$8.4 billion in par value.

CDIAC relies on the accuracy of the information submitted on the Report of Final sale to analyze market trends for California public issuers. Most of the information noted above can be accessed through CDIAC's searchable online Debt Issuance Database, www.treasurer.ca.gov/cdiac/debt.asp.

UPDATES TO APRIL

- 15 MSRB filed proposed Rule G-42 with the SEC to establish core standards of conduct for municipal advisors and provide guidance and clarity regarding fiduciary duties and duties of care and fair dealing.
- MSRB released an outline of the content that will be tested on the Municipal Advisor Representation Qualification (Series 50) Examination. The introduction of a pilot examination is expected later this year and the permanent examination is anticipated for 2016.

MAY

- 4 Comments are due to the SEC on a proposed rule to extend the reporting and dissemination requirements under Regulation SBSR.
- 18 SEC final Regulation SBSR regarding the reporting and dissemination of security-based swap information becomes effective. Additionally, the SEC final rule governing security-based swap data repository registration processes, duties, and core principles becomes effective.
