


California Public Debt Issuance Monthly Data

CALIFORNIA PUBLIC DEBT ISSUANCE, OCTOBER (IN MILLIONS)1





STATE* VERSUS LOCAL DEBT ISSUANCE, OCTOBER (IN MILLIONS)1






TIMELINESS OF SUBMITTAL OF REPORTS

REPORTS OF PROPOSED DEBT ISSUANCE (RPDIs)1 RECEIVED OCTOBER 2016



1 California Government Code Section 8855(i) stated that RPDIs must be submitted no later than 30 days prior to issuance to the commission by any method approved by the commission.

REPORTS OF FINAL SALE (RFSs)2 RECEIVED OCTOBER 2016



2 California Government Code Section 8855(j) states that the issuer of any debt issue of state or local government, not later than 21 days after the sale of the debt, shall submit a report of final sale to the commission by any method approved by the commission.

Accessing Issuance Documents From DebtWatch

In November of 2015, the California State Treasurer's Office debuted DebtWatch, an online portal through which the public can access CDIAC's comprehensive database of public debt issuance dating back to 1985. Since its debut, DebtWatch has provided over sixty different data elements on each debt issuance in both an inter-

active graphic display and spreadsheet format. Now, users who would like to confirm the data displayed, gain greater context for the data they are viewing, or research additional data not collected on the reports submitted by issuers can access the debt issuance documents submitted to CDIAC by issuers pursuant to Government Code section 8855 (j).


Each Report of Final Sale filed with CDIAC is accompanied by documentation related to the debt issuance. Depending upon the type of debt issued, these documents will vary from issue to issue and may include official statements, bond specimens, indentures,

resolutions of the governing body, promissory notes, leases, loan agreements, instalment sales agreements, and other debt related contracts.

The issuance documents are located in the various tabular views of the data available in DebtWatch. A tabular (or spreadsheet) view is accessible in the three different locations: 1) "Data Lens"; 2) "Compare Issuers"; and 3) "Data Set". Below is a view of each of the three locations and where to find the documents.

DL

Data Lens (End of Display)



The issuance documents are accessed simply by clicking on the .pdf link. All documents submitted by the issuers for a specific issues are viewed in the same .pdf file. Use the bookmarks feature within your .pdf viewer to view an index of the document collection and move easily from document to document.

If the documents are available, the "Issuance Documents" column will display the CDIAC number followed by the pdf extension. If no documents were submitted by the issuer with their final issuance report, the field will return "None Submitted". The field will

return "Pending", if documents were submitted, but are still in the process of being made available. "Pending" documents, while not online yet, are available on request.


CDIAC's vision is to make all the issuance documents that have been collected by CDIAC over the many years available on DebtWatch. The effort is well underway, but it is a work-inprogress. The vast majority of the documents for issues from 2008 through 2014 are available. Documents from 2015 to current are progressing and will appear on DebtWatch over the course of the next few monthly up-

dates of the site's data. On a going-forward basis, newly submitted documents should appear with monthly site updates. CDIAC is preparing to start digitizing documents for issues prior to 2008 and will roll those out in multi-year batches as completed.



Implementation of Senate Bill 1029 (Hertzberg)

Senate Bill 1029 (Hertzberg, Chapter 307, Statutes of 2016), which takes effect on January 1, 2017, amended Government Code section 8855. Specifically, SB 1029 amended section 8855(i) addressing the California Debt and Investment Advisory Commission's (CDIAC) Report of Proposed Debt Issuance (RPDI). Local agencies will now have to certify on the RPDI that they have adopted debt policies that include specific statutorily required elements and that the proposed issuance is consistent with those policies.

Issuers that submit a Report of Final Sale (RFS) to CDIAC on or after January 21, 2017 are also subject to the requirements of newly added Section 8855(k), pertaining to annual debt reports. Section 8855(k) requires state and local issuers to submit an annual debt report to CDIAC on any debt for which it has submitted the RFS. The annual debt report must cover the reporting period of July 1 to June 30 and must be submitted to CDIAC no later than January 31st of each year. For issuers who submit an RFS between January 21, 2017 and June 30, 2017, the initial annual debt reports will be due no later than January 31, 2018.

CDIAC issued a Request for Public Comment on October 27, 2016. The comment period closed November 18, 2016. CDIAC is now reviewing comments received and will incorporate them into the final implementation approach. CDIAC plans to issue further guidance on complying with SB 1029 prior to January 1, 2017.

Municipal Market Regulatory Activity Calendar of Events

NOVEMBER 2016

- 1 SEC final rule requiring security-based swap data repositories to make data available to regulators and other authorities became effective.
- 11 MSRB filed a proposed rule change with the SEC to extend and modernize the MSRB's customer complaint and related recordkeeping rules to municipal advisors; the proposed changes would affect Rules G-8, G-9, G-10, and G-32.
- 14 Comments are due to the MSRB on proposed amendments to Rule G-3 to establish a continuing education requirement for municipal advisors.
- 16 Amendments to MSRB Rule G-12 instituting new closeout rules for inter-dealer failed transactions went into effect.
- 23 Comments were due to GASB on its exposure draft of *Omnibus 201X*.

DECEMBER 2016

- 15 Requirements of GASB Statement No. 81, *Irrevocable Split-Interest Agreements*, become effective for periods beginning after this date.
- Omments are due to GASB on an exposure draft of Implementation Guide No. 201X-X, Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefit Plans Other Than Pension Plans.

JUNE 2017

- 15 Provisions of GASB Statement No. 82, Pension Issues an Amendment of GASB Statements No. 67, No. 68, and No. 73, become effective for fiscal years beginning after this date.
- 15 Provisions of GASB Statement No. 75, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions, become effective for fiscal years beginning after this date.

SEPTEMBER 2017

30 IRS fiscal year 2017 sequestration rates for certain qualified bonds are effective for subsidy payments until this date.
