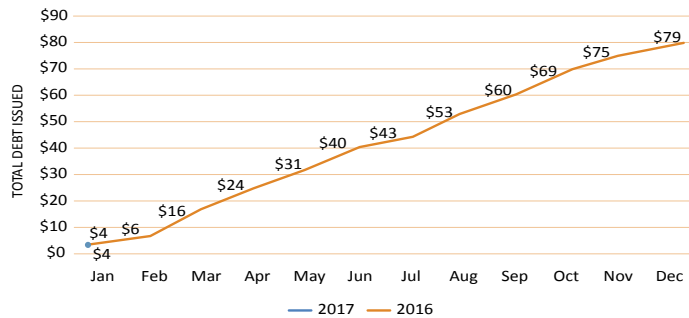


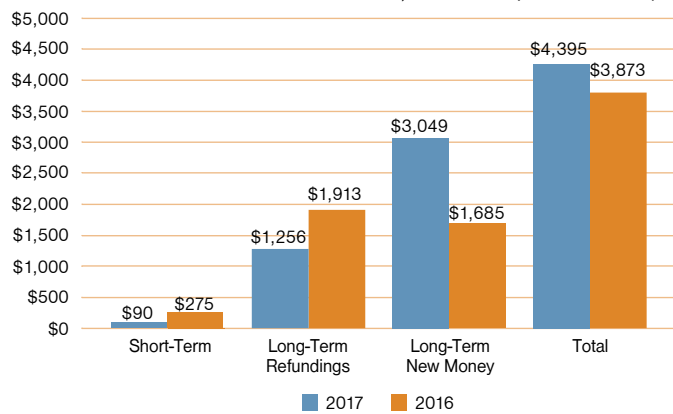

CUMULATIVE CALIFORNIA PUBLIC DEBT ISSUANCE (IN BILLIONS)¹



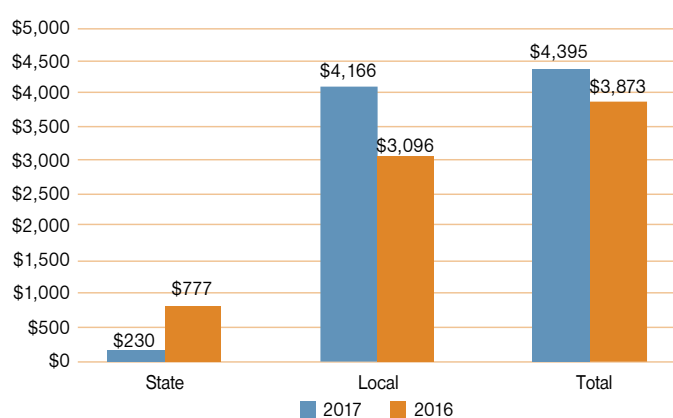

STATE* VERSUS LOCAL DEBT ISSUANCE, JANUARY (IN MILLIONS)¹

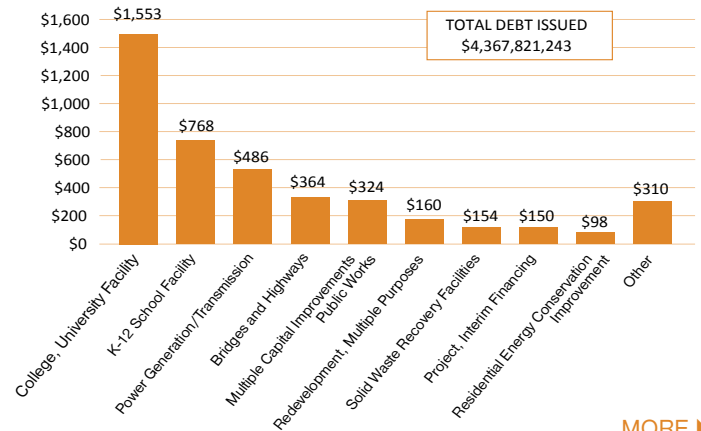

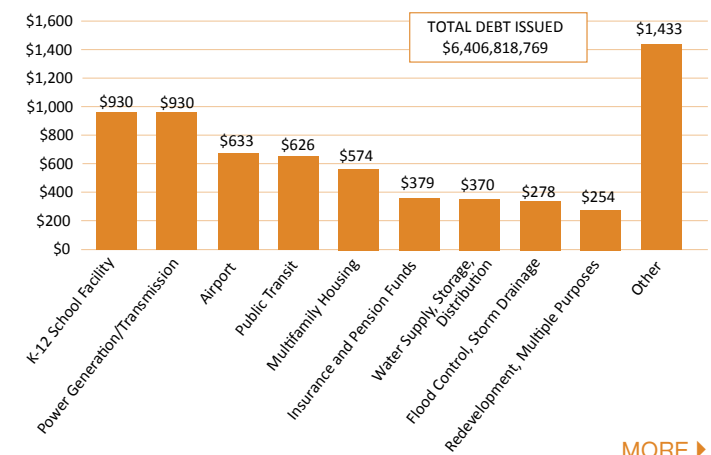

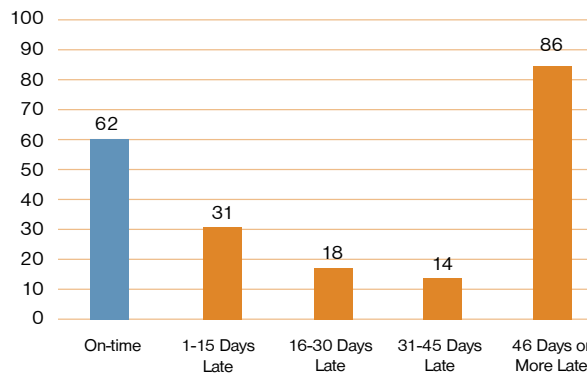

¹ California Government Code Section 8855(i) states that the issuer of any proposed debt issue of state and local government shall, no later than 30 days prior to the sale of any debt issue, submit a report of proposed issuance to the commission by any method approved by the commission.

Debt Issuance 2016

Public agencies in the US issued \$444.8 billion in debt in 2016 according to Thomson Reuter's data. The amount eclipsed the record of \$433 billion set in 2010. In California, state and local agencies issued \$76.9 billion in 2016, up 13.3 percent from \$67.9 billion in 2015 (Figure 1).

Overall new money issuance in California increased by 9.8 percent from 2015 to 2016 (Figure 2a and 2b). Local agencies sold 5.7 percent more new money debt in 2016, while state new money issuance increased 27.0 percent. Refunding, a portion of long-term debt issuance, rose 18.3 percent statewide from \$37.1 billion in 2015 to \$43.9 billion in 2016.

NEW MONEY AND REFUNDING – 2015 VERSUS 2016 (THOUSANDS)

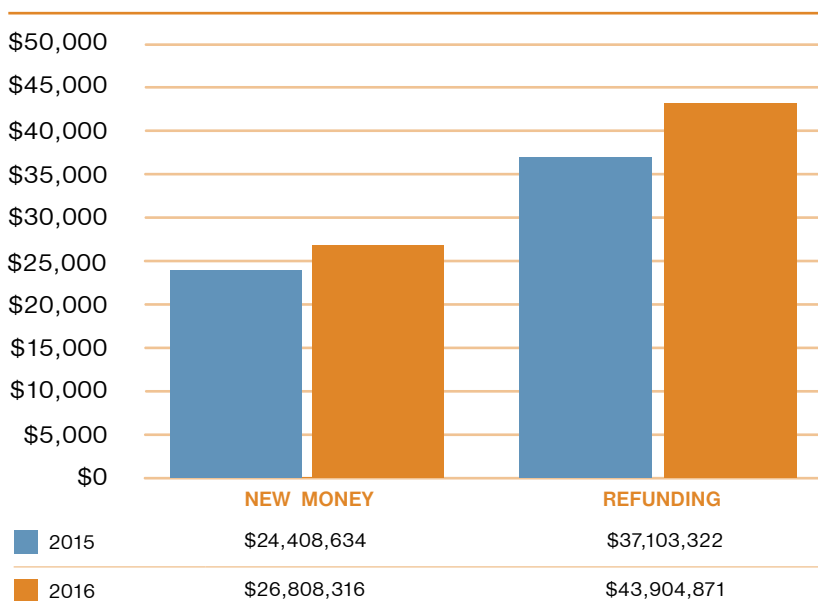

In 2016, capital improvements surpassed education as the top purpose for which state and local agencies issued debt. In fact, new money and refunding issuance for capital improvements jumped nearly 20.8 percent from 2015. Of all purpose categories tracked by CDIAC,

Hospital and Health Care Facilities showed the greatest growth in 2016, increasing nearly 129.4 percent (Figure 3).

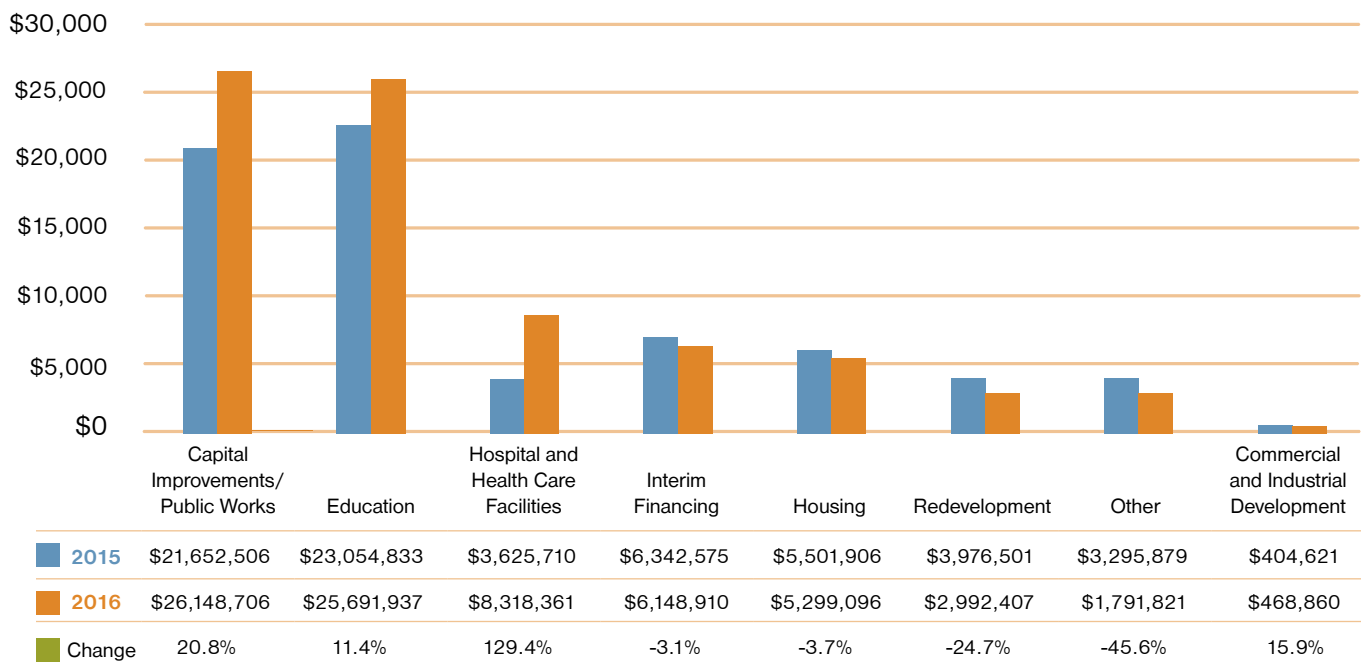
