



### STATE\* VERSUS LOCAL DEBT ISSUANCE, MARCH (IN MILLIONS)1







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# Property Assessed Clean Energy Financing


The Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) program allows both residential and commercial property owners to enter into voluntary contractual assessments with a local public agency (public finance authority or PFA) to finance energy or water efficiency improvements to their homes or businesses. Property owners repay the loans through special assessments or taxes added to their property-tax bills. Local agencies may use either public or private capital to fund their PACE programs.

Since receiving its first reports of PACE issuance in 2009, the California Debt and Investment Advisory Commission (CDIAC) has tracked an ever-increasing volume of loans. In calendar year 2015, total statewide PACE principal reported to CDIAC was nearly \$864 million, almost triple the amount from the previous year. In 2016, PACE programs issued \$1.41 billion in loans, a 63 percent increase over 2015.¹ California PACE financings account for close to 80 percent of the total of such financings nationwide.²

In California, PACE loans can be issued under either of two different statutory authorizations, commonly referred to as "AB 811" and "SB 555." AB 811 is essentially an amendment to the Improvement Act of 1911, whereas SB 555 is an amendment to the Mello-Roos Com-

munity Facilities District Act. To date, the vast majority of the PACE issuance reported to CDIAC has been through the AB 811 scheme.

Local agencies in California use a variety of structures to issue PACE debt. The Western Riverside Council of Governments (WRCOG) and the County of Los Angeles have used third-party administrators and private lenders to facilitate over \$1.6 billion in bond issuance over the past two years. Similarly, San Bernardino Associated Governments (SANBAG), California Statewide Communities Development Authority (CSCDA), and California Enterprise Development Authority (CEDA) run privately funded PACE programs with third-party administrators. Alternatively, the counties of Sonoma and Placer use their public finance authorities (PFAs) to issue special assessment bonds under the Marks-Roos Local Bond Pooling Act.5

In 2016, PACE issues for commercial improvements increased by 53 percent over 2015. However, residential application is by far the dominant market sector. PACE loans for this purpose increased 63 percent from \$849 million in 2015 to \$1.38 billion in 2016.

PACE financing continues to rise steadily as a percentage of the total debt issued by local agencies in California. In 2015, PACE accounted for 1.8 percent of the total issuance. In 2016, the percentage increased to 2.5 percent. Indeed, key to the growth of PACE is the involvement of public agencies, which investors see as an implicit financial backstop. The belief that governments stand behind the loans is a major reason why investors are attracted to PACE bonds.6 The rapid growth of PACE, reports of loan recipients being misled, and the fear of possible defaults have brought calls for more regulation. California Gov. Jerry Brown signed AB 26937 in September 2016, establishing new re-

quirements for uniform disclosures for PACE loans. The bill seeks to make the disclosure of lending terms more like those for mortgages. It requires that property owners receive a detailed disclosure of financing costs and fees, interest rate, total amount of principal and interest paid over the term of the financing, mortgage impound implications, penalties for late payments of property taxes, and other less apparent implications of this particular type of financing. Efforts to enhance disclosure should not inhibit the growth of PACE financing, but will help to ensure that this popular financing tool, providing for environmentally sustainable property improvements, remains viable for future borrowers.

### Municipal Market Regulatory Activity Calendar of Events

### **MAY 2017**

Comments are due on the SEC proposed rule amendments to SEC Rule 15c2-12 to improve disclosure of financial obligations incurred outside of the public market (i.e. bank loans). The SEC is proposing to expand the list of "material events" so that municipal borrowers would have to disclose the terms of any bank loans or other financial obligations borrowers may have entered into with a bank outside the public markets and it is also proposing to add the disclosure of the details of any swaps contracts municipalities enter into to, for instance, hedge against interest-rate changes.

### **JUNE 2017**

- 15 Provisions of GASB Statement No. 82, Pension Issues an Amendment of GASB Statements No. 67, No. 68, and No. 73, become effective for fiscal years beginning after this date.
- 15 Provisions of GASB Statement No. 75, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions, become effective for fiscal years beginning after this date.

### SEPTEMBER 2017

30 IRS fiscal year 2017 sequestration rates for certain qualified bonds are effective for subsidy payments until this date.

### OCTOBER 2017

3 MSRB rule changes consisting of (i) amendments to MSRB Rule G-10, on delivery of investor brochure; Rule G-8, on books and records to be made by brokers, dealers, and municipal securities dealers and municipal advisors; and Rule G-9 on preservation of records, and (ii) an MSRB notice regarding electronic delivery and receipt of information by municipal advisors under Rule G-32, on disclosure in connection with primary offerings take effect.
