



CALIFORNIA PUBLIC DEBT ISSUANCE, AUGUST (IN MILLIONS)1




STATE* VERSUS LOCAL DEBT ISSUANCE, AUGUST (IN MILLIONS)1







School Districts, Smaller Issuers Maintaining Revival of Bond Insurance

Before the collapse of the housing market and the ensuing financial crisis of 2008, roughly half of municipal debt issuance by volume was insured. This was true nationwide as well as in California. The popularity of bond insurance was due in large measure to the credit ratings of the two main insurers - AMBAC and MBIA - whose AAA-level ratings were effectively transferred to the underlying debt. But their ironclad reputation along with their economic viability evaporated during market collapse.1 And along with it, the bond insurance market.

In California, the drop in insured deals from 2007 to 2008 was dramatic. In 2007, 54 percent of the total debt volume issued carried bond insurance. In 2008, that figure fell to 19 percent and reached a low point of 3.3 percent in 2010. (Figure 1)

Since bottoming out seven years ago, bond insurance – particularly for smaller issues – has been making a modest comeback. This is due, in part to credit upgrades to two of the major insurers and to certain, high-profile market events which have directed the attention of investors to other risk mitigations.² The share of total California public debt volume carrying insurance has been increasing by an average of a percentage point per year since 2010. The most drastic jump was seen in 2014, when 11.0 percent of deals were insured. This represented a near doubling of the number of insured deals in 2013 (5.8 percent). The first half of 2017 shows something of a leveling-off from the previous year even though the insured market share remains at a much higher level than during the years immediately following the crash.

Two new firms have supplanted AM-BAC and MBIA as the major players in the bond insurance industry. These are Build America Mutual (aka BAM) and Assured Guaranty Corp. (which insures along with its subsidiary, Municipal Assurance Corp.)³

Assured, Build America Mutual, and National Public Finance Guarantee insured a total of \$3.9 billion in issued debt in California from January through June of 2017, down 7.0% from \$4.2 billion during the first half of 2016. (Figure 2)

Overwhelmingly, K-12 school districts were the most frequent users of bond insurance, with 112 issues carrying insurance from January through June of 2017, up from 83 in for the same period in 2016. Insurance proved most popular with school districts issuing small- to medium-sized par amounts. The overall average insured par amount dropped from \$26M in first half of 2016 to \$22M for the same period of 2017. (Figure 3) The data indicates that school districts are particularly sensitive to risk considerations, possibly as a result of news events such as those focusing on the Poway Unified School District. Interest in bond insurance may continue to depend upon rating agencies' assessment of the insurers' credit-worthiness. Additional review of the major insurers by S&P is currently underway,⁴ and its results will likely largely determine whether the volume of insured debt continues to fluctuate or will show a more pronounced change.

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Municipal Market Regulatory Activity Calendar of Events

SEPTEMBER 2017

- 5 Effective date of MSRB Rule G-12 and G-15 on confirmation, clearance, settlement and other uniform practice requirements with respect to transactions with customers, to define regular-way settlement for municipal securities transactions as occurring on a two-day settlement cycle (T+2).
- 7 The MSRB announced that market-wide trading statistics are available on EMMA. The new data, not previously available to the public, includes a daily state-by-state view of municipal bond trading activity highlighting the most actively traded securities and issuers.
