


STATE* VERSUS LOCAL DEBT ISSUANCE, SEPTEMBER (IN MILLIONS)1







Mello-Roos Financing: A Comparison of Issuance in Fiscal Years 2014-15 and 2015-16

The Community Facilities Act of 1982 (commonly known as the Mello-Roos Act) allows local governments to establish community facilities districts (CFDs or districts) as a means of financing public facilities and services. Debt service on the bonds issued by CFDs is paid

through the levy of a special tax on properties within the district. Local agencies that have issued Mello-Roos bonds after January 1, 1993 must report annually to the California Debt and Investment Advisory Commission (CDIAC) on the status of their outstanding bonds.^{2,3}

The data in this article is based on yearly fiscal status reports received for debt issued in fiscal years (FYs) 2014-15 and 2015-16.

Total issuance volume decreased by 32.2 percent when between FY 2014-15 and 2015-16. Although new money issuance showed a 29 percent increase year over year, refundings decreased by approximately 52 percent during FY 2015-16 as compared to FY 2014-15. Mello Roos CFDs also participated in 63 fewer financings in FY 2015-16, a 28.4 percent decrease. (Figure 1)

K-12 schools and cities have accounted for at least 70 percent of the Mello-Roos principal issued during the last two fiscal years. In FY 2014-15, K-12 schools were the largest issuer with cities second, but these two issuer types switched places in the FY 2015-16 ranking. (Figure 2)

In FY 2014-15, the number of Mello-Roos issues and volume issued was highest in Riverside County. Ninety-eight CFDs in Riverside County issued 110 times for over \$869 million. Issuance in Orange County was second in volume with just a fraction of Riverside's sales - 12 issues by nine CFDs for \$572.2 million. (Figure 3a)

In FY 2015-16, 11 districts in Orange County made it the top county by issuing \$398.7 million in 13 sales. Riverside County still outpaced Orange County in terms of number of issuances with 52 districts conducting 61 sales, but places second in terms of total principal. (Figure 3b)

Annual reporting requirements also include data on, among other things, the minimum reserve balance required, the reserve balance on hand, special taxes due and unpaid, the number of delinquent parcels, the tax due on delinquent parcels, the number of foreclosed parcels, and the taxes due on foreclosed parcels.

RESERVE BALANCE. CFDs reported reserve balances for all debt issued in FY 2014-15 and FY 2015-16 equaled or exceeded the required minimums.

TAXES DUE AND UNPAID. When aggregated by county, Alameda County CFDs reported the highest percentage of unpaid taxes for debt issued in FY 2014-15 - 7.6 percent unpaid. All of the other 20 counties reporting on FY 2014-15 issues showed percentages between zero and one percent. Among the FY 2015-16 issues, Ventura County's CFDs reported the highest percentage of unpaid taxes, but only 2.3 percent were unpaid.

A review of the unpaid taxes of individual CFDs, found that only one of the 174 CFDs that reported on FY 2014-15 issues showed unpaid taxes of more than ten percent - Livermore CFD No 99-1 in Alameda County reported 15.8 percent of the special taxes due were unpaid. None of the 173 unique districts reporting on FY

2015-16 issues showed unpaid taxes of ten percent or more.

DELINQUENT PARCELS. CFDs reported a total of 4,216 delinquent parcels related to their FY 2015-16 issues with approximately \$1.8 million in special taxes due. This represented an increase in the number of delinquent parcels (42.1 percent) but a decrease in the amount of special taxes due on those parcels (-56.6 percent) from the same totals reported on FY 2014-15 issues. Figure 4a shows the top ten counties with the highest amount of delinquent parcels and the corresponding delinquent amounts for the issuance in each fiscal year. Figure 4b lists the top ten issuers in each fiscal year with the highest number of delinquencies reported. The RNR School Financing Authority CFD No 92-1 (Kern County) and Irvine Unified School District CFD No 09-1 (Orange County) are the only two districts in the top ten for issues in both fiscal years.



FORECLOSURES - NUMBER AND AMOUNT OF SPECIAL TAXES DUE.4 Of the 101 total foreclosures reported on debt issued and reported in FY 2014-15, Riverside County had the highest number, 86 with an amount due of approximately \$180 thousand. Seventy-four of these foreclosures commenced between FY 2006-07 and FY 2013-14 associated with debt issued in prior years and refunded by debt issued in FY 2014-15. In FY 2015-16, these CFDs added 33 more foreclosures associated with their debt issued in FY 2014-15, with 25 occurring in Riverside County for \$148 thousand in delinquent special taxes. Los Angeles County was a distant second, with 15 foreclosures and \$52.5 thousand in special taxes due. (Figure 5a)

A review of the foreclosures in individual districts associated with debt issued in FY 2014-15 found that Moreno Valley Unified School District CFD No 2004-6 in Riverside County reported the highest number - 28 foreclosures with commencement dates between FY 2006-07 through 2015-16 and a total of \$67.9 thousand in special taxes due. Lake Elsinore CFD No 2006-2, also in Riverside County, had the highest amount of special taxes due, almost \$115 thousand from 13 foreclosures which began in FY 2015-16. Four of the top five CFDs that reported foreclosures on debt issued in FY 2014-15 are located in Riverside County. One Los Angeles issuer was in the top five. Saugus Union School District reported 12 foreclosure actions and almost \$28 thousand due in special taxes. (Figure 5b)

Only two of the 136 CFDs that reported on debt issued in FY 2015-16 reported any foreclosures. San Jacinto CFD No 2002-1 (Riverside County) reported the highest number of foreclosures and special taxes due - 11 parcels and \$38.5 thousand due. The San Jacinto CFD No 2002-1 issue was a refunding bond issuance that inherited no prior foreclosures from the debt it refinanced. The new money bond issuance of RNR School Financing Authority CFD No 92-1 (Kern County) reported four parcels in foreclosure and just over \$10 thousand due. (Figure 5c)

DRAW ON RESERVE/DEFAULT FILINGS. Issuers of Mello-Roos bonds are required to notify CDIAC of any draw on reserve funds to pay principal or interest which reduces the reserve balance to less than the required amount and any failure to pay principal or interest on any scheduled payment date (default), There were no reports of draws on reserve or defaults for debt issued in FYs 2014-15 or 2015-16.

In 2011, CDIAC began accepting voluntary filings of replenishments to reserve accounts. In FY 2014-15 and 2015-16 no voluntarily replenishment filings were submitted.
