


CALIFORNIA PUBLIC DEBT ISSUANCE, APRIL (IN MILLIONS)1




STATE* VERSUS LOCAL DEBT ISSUANCE, APRIL (IN MILLIONS)1






Past and Present Landscape of Bond Insurance

BACKGROUND AND DECLINE OF MARKET PENETRATION

The majority of municipal bonds issued by states, local governments, and other public entities in California are insured. Through the 1980s and 1990s, bond insurance saw exponential growth as a percentage of the outstanding debt. In 1980, the "penetration rate," or the annual ratio of insured paper to debt issued in the municipal bond market was just three (3%) percent, but in 2005 it was approaching 60 percent. The increase was due in large measure to the credit ratings of the two primary insurers - AMBAC and MBIA - whose AAA-level ratings were effectively transferred to the underlying debt. Their seemingly invulnerable reputation, along with their economic viability, evaporated during the 2007-2008 market collapse.1

Since the Great Recession, financial guaranty insurers withdrew from the residential mortgage-backed securities (RMBS) market. Although the RMBS market fell outside the traditional purview of municipal bond insurance, bond insurers and many rating agencies were active in this market. For some insurers, the RMBS market became a greater portion of their insured issuances than municipal bonds. This was the most significant contributing factor in the dramatic decline in the

penetration rate since the housing market collapse.

At their peak in 2005, bond insurers covered about 57 percent of new municipal bond issuance. Beginning in 2008, the deterioration in insurers' rating lowered the penetration rate to less than nine (9%) percent in 2009. Since 2010, the bond insurance penetration rate has averaged just over five percent of the municipal bond market.^{2,3}

Figure 1 shows annual percent of municipal bond insurance market penetration rate for years 2007-2017. Penetration rate is the percent of all municipal bond issues in the United States that carry a financial guaranty.

THE CASE FOR INSURED BONDS

A series of high-profile municipal defaults, bankruptcies, and restructurings in Puerto Rico, Michigan, Pennsylvania, California in the wake of the 2007-2008 financial crisis demonstrates the value of bond insurance in the public finance market. Holders of insured bonds from those municipalities were protected from any potential loss by insurers.⁴ In the secondary market, insured bonds generally exhibited price stability relative to comparable uninsured bonds of distressed issuers. Additionally, investors were spared the burdens of having to defend their rights in court.

The economic value of bond insurance to the governmental unit, agency, or other issuer offering bonds or other securities is a saving in interest costs reflecting the difference in yield payable on an insured bond from that on the same bond if uninsured.⁵

Figure 2 shows top 10 insurers of municipal bond insurance in California for years 2016 & 2017. Market Share is the percent of total insured par in the California.

CURRENT INSURERS IN CALIFORNIA

Assured Guaranty represented the only major player in the new issue bond insurance market in California until Build America Mutual (BAM) entered the market in 2012. In California, Assured accounted for nearly 53 percent of total insured par in 2016, and BAM followed with about 38 percent of total insured par. In 2017, however, BAM insured almost twice as much principal value as Assured. Figure 2 shows the top 10 bond

insurers in California for years 2016 and 2017, and their respective market share of total insured par.

Overwhelmingly, K-12 school districts were the most frequent users of bond insurance, with 161 issues carrying insurance in both 2016 and 2017, despite the overall lower number of insured issues in 2017. The overall average insured par amount dropped from \$48.9M in 2016 to \$38.8M for 2017 (Figure 3). Figure 3 shows types of issuers utilizing municipal bond insurance in California for years 2016 & 2017.

Interest in bond insurance will continue to depend upon on the insurers' credit-worthiness as determined by the rating agencies. In mid-2017, review of the major insurers by Standards and Poor led to a two-notch downgrade in credit ratings for National Public Finance Guarantee Corporation (National), and conversely reaffirmed BAM's AA rating after earlier being placed on negative watch.⁶ However, the unfavorable attention directed to BAM from the inquiry appears to have directly impacted its market share in 2017.
