



California Public Debt Issuance Monthly Data


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CALIFORNIA PUBLIC DEBT ISSUANCE, JUNE (IN MILLIONS)¹





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



² Under California Government Code Section 8855(j), "The issuer of any debt issue of state or local government, not later than 21 days after the sale of the debt, shall submit a report of final sale to the commission by any method approved by the commission. A copy of the final official statement for the issue shall accompany the report of final sale. The Commission may require information to be submitted in the report of final sale that is considered appropriate."

California state and local agencies issued approximately \$32.3 billion of long- and short-term debt in the first half of calendar year 2016, an 18.5 percent decrease from the same period in 2015.¹ The decrease in California volume was sharper than the 2.2 percent drop reported for the same period nationwide.²

BOND COUNSELS

Ranked by number of deals, California's leading bond counsel firm since 2013 had been Best Best & Krieger (BBK). Its edge over other firms was attributable to its continuing role as bond counsel to local public agencies issuing bonds under the Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) Program.³ PACE allows a local public agency to issue loans to individual property owners for the purpose of making energy efficiency improvements. While the principal amounts are low, the structure of the transactions translates into hundreds of debt issuance reports submitted to CDIAC. As issuance under the PACE program continues to expand, more firms are participating in all aspects of the deals

involved. In quarters 1 and 2 (Q1 & Q2) of 2016, Jones Hall supplanted BBK as California's top bond counsel firm ranked by number of deals. Jones Hall was responsible for 30.7 percent of deals that used a bond counsel, largely due to its role in PACE issuance by the California Statewide Communities Development Authority (CSCDA) as well as the County of Los Angeles. Best Best & Krieger, still a heavy PACE player, now ranks second with 28.7 percent of the deals. Stradling Yocca Carlson & Rauth, Orrick Herrington & Sutcliffe, and Quint & Thimmig rounded out the top five firms for the first half of calendar 2016 on a deal basis. These same five firms occupied the top five rankings in the first half of 2015 (Figure 1).

Ranking of bond counsel firms by par amount issued produced an entirely different result. Orrick was by far the leading firm in California. In fact, deals on which Orrick was bond counsel accounted for over \$15 billion, almost four times the amount of the second ranking firm, Stradling Yocca Carlson & Rauth. Jones Hall, Hawkins Delafield & Wood, and Kutak Rock placed third, fourth and fifth, respectively. BBK dropped back to eighth based on par value. Bond counsels participated in 98.3 percent of the reported financings in California during the first half of 2016, a slight decrease from the 99.2 percent during the same period in 2015.

FINANCIAL ADVISORS

As with bond counsel firms, the same five firms of Q1 & Q2 of 2015 comprise the top five spots during the same period of 2016. California's leading financial advisory firm for the first half of 2016, based on deal count, was The PFM Group/Public Financial Management, Inc. (PFM). PFM continued to hold on to the top spot despite a drop from 331 deals for the first half of 2015 to 256 from January through June of 2016. PFM serves as the financial advisor on the PACE financings in Riverside and San Bernardino Counties, which constituted 84 percent of deals in which they participated. Isom Advisors/Urban Futures; KNN Public Finance (KNN), Fieldman, Rolapp & Associates; and Dale Scott & Company, Inc. rounded out the top five fi-

nancial advisory firms on a number of deals basis for Q1 & Q2 of 2016. (Figure 2). When measured by volume issued, Public Resources Advisory Group (PRAG) was California's top financial advisory firm, participating in 23 deals with a total par amount of \$8.8 billion. PFM, KNN, Fieldman Rolapp, and Swap Financial Group LLC complete the top five on a par amount basis.

Based on number of deals, financial advisors participated in 59.5 percent of the reported public debt issuance during Q1 & Q2 of 2016, a decrease of 17.1 percent from the same period of 2015. Based upon par amount issued, financial advisory firms participated in eighty-eight percent of the debt issued in the first half of 2016. This represented a nine percent increase over 2015.

UNDERWRITERS

California's top two underwriting firms for Q1 & Q2 of 2016, as measured by number of deals, were Stifel Nicolaus & Company, Inc. (Stifel) with 100, and RBC Capital Markets with 36 deals. While Stifel retained the top spot, RBC supplanted Piper Jaffray & Co. (Piper Jaffray) for the number two spot compared with the same period of 2015. Stifel and RBC together underwrote over 50 percent

more deals as the remaining three of the top five firms combined. Those are Citigroup Global Markets, Morgan Stanley & Co., and Piper Jaffray (Figure 3). Citigroup Global Markets eclipsed all other underwriting firms on a par value basis by purchasing 21.4 percent, or approximately \$6.2 billion, of California's debt involving an underwriter. From January through June of 2016, underwriters purchased nearly 90 percent of the state's mu-

nicipal offerings by par amount.⁴ No participation by an underwriter was reported on 752 deals totaling approximately \$3.2 billion in par value.

CDIAC relies on the accuracy of the information submitted on the Report of Final Sale to analyze market trends for California public issuers. Mello-Roos and Marks-Roos Reporting Requirements

Issuers of Mello-Roos and Marks-Roos bonds with debt outstanding are required by statute to report certain information to the California Debt and Investment Advisory Commission (CDIAC). Described in this article are the annual and periodic reporting requirements for issuers of these types of bonds.

YEARLY FISCAL STATUS REPORTS (YFSRs)

MELLO-ROOS REPORTS. Community Facilities Districts (CFDs) issuing under the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Districts Act on or after January 1, 1993 are required to annually file with CDIAC no later than October 30th a Yearly Fiscal Status Report (YFSR).¹

The 2015-16 YFSR report covers Mello-Roos bonds that were issued on or after January 1, 1993 through June 30, 2016 and contains specific information on each financing, including fund balances, assessed values, tax collection and reported delinquencies. Issuers are required to file the annual Mello-Roos YFSR until the bonds have matured or been redeemed.

MARKS-ROOS REPORTS. Bonds which were issued under the Marks-Roos Local Bond Pooling Act on or after January 1, 1996 and, which used the bond proceeds to make one or more loans to local agencies

or to purchase the bonds of one or more local agencies, are also required to annually file an YFSR with CDIAC no later than October 30th.²

The 2015-16 report covers bonds issued on or after January 1, 1996 through June 30, 2016. Information contained in the report includes the principal amount of bonds outstanding for the authority bonds, and local obligations purchased (including loans) with Marks-Roos bond proceeds, reserve fund balance, and administrative fees paid and collected. Annual Marks-Roos reporting is also required until the bonds have matured or been redeemed.

To facilitate this mandatory reporting, CDIAC has developed a YFSR for each type of bond. These reports may be submitted electronically using CDIAC's online reports. The Data Collection and Analysis Unit (Data Unit) mails courtesy reminders annually by August 31st to all issuers of Mello-Roos and Marks-Roos bonds identified in the CDIAC debt issuance database. This reminder contains the CDIAC Number and password needed to access online filing. Guidelines for completing the reports are available on CDIAC's website.³

DRAW-ON-RESERVE AND DEFAULTS

Issuers of both Mello-Roos and Marks-Roos bonds are also required to report any defaults or draws on reserve to CDIAC.⁴ Notification to CDIAC must occur within ten days of the default or draw on reserve. Unlike the YFSR, reporting of a default or draw on reserve applies to all Mello-Roos and Marks-Roos bonds regardless of issuance date.

MELLO-ROOS issuers are required to report either:

- A failure to pay principal and interest on a scheduled payment date, or
- A withdrawal from a reserve fund to pay principal and interest on the bond, if the withdrawal reduces the reserve fund below the required reserve amount.

MARKS-ROOS authorities are required to report either:

- A failure to pay principal and interest on a scheduled payment date, or
- A withdrawal from a reserve fund to pay principal and interest on bonds issued by the authority or any bonds acquired by the authority.

Although not statutorily required, CDIAC issuers may voluntarily report to CDIAC the replenishment of reserve funds, as well.

CDIAC developed the Mello-Roos/Marks-Roos Draw on Reserve/Default Filing Form to facilitate reporting. All draws on reserve and/or defaults and replenishments may be filed using our online form, which can be accessed using the issue's CDIAC Number and password. Access to the online reporting portal and all reporting forms, instructions and reporting requirements, is available on the CDIAC website under "Reporting Debt Issuance" at www.treasurer.ca.gov/cdiac/reporting.asp.

JULY 2016

- 1** The Federal Reserve's final rule amending the liquidity coverage ratio rule and modified liquidity coverage ratio rule (LCR) to include certain municipal securities as level 2B high-quality liquid assets (HQLA) became effective.

- 18** Treasury Department and Internal Revenue Service (IRS) final regulations, which amend arbitrage restrictions applicable to tax-exempt bonds and other tax-advantaged bonds issued by State and local governments, were published to the Federal Register.

- 18** Amendments to MSRB Rule G-14, requiring dealers to report post-trade data to the MSRB's Real-Time Transaction Reporting System (RTRS), became effective.

AUGUST 2016

- 16** SEC final rule requiring security-based swap dealers and major security-based swap participants to provide trade acknowledgments and to verify those trade acknowledgments in security-based swap transactions goes into effect.

- 17** Amendments to MSRB Rule G-37, on political contributions and prohibitions on municipal securities business, become effective as well as related amendments to Rules G-8 and G-9 and Forms G-37 and G-37x.

SEPTEMBER 2016

- 12** MSRB's permanent Municipal Advisor Representative Qualification Examination (Series 50) will be made available. Municipal advisors must take and pass this examination by September 12, 2017 in order to engage in municipal advisory activities.

DECEMBER 2016

- 15** Requirements of GASB Statement No. 81, *Irrevocable Split-Interest Agreements*, become effective for periods beginning after this date.

JUNE 2017

- 15** Provisions of GASB Statement No. 82, *Pension Issues – an Amendment of GASB Statements No. 67, No. 68, and No. 73*, become effective for fiscal years beginning after this date.

- 15** Provisions of GASB Statement No. 75, *Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions*, become effective for fiscal years beginning after this date.
