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Martin Cassell is the chief executive and investment officer at Chandler Asset Management and is a principal of the firm. Mr. Cassell is responsible for defining, planning, and directing firm programs and heads implementation of the firm's investment strategies and portfolio risk management. He designed the proprietary quantitative models that drive the firm's investment process, establishing duration, structure, and asset allocation throughout client portfolios. He began his investment career in 1987 managing the liquidity portfolio at World Savings and Loan.
