1. CALL TO ORDER & ROLL CALL

2. MINUTES

Mr. Gordon asked if there were any questions or comments concerning the meeting minutes from the meeting held August 15, 2017. There were none.

3. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Ms. Webster-Hawkins greeted the members of the Board.

Ms. Webster-Hawkins proceeded to update the Board about CPCFA's pending legislative items.

She stated that AB 1553 has been passed by both houses and is awaiting the Governor's signature. This is the bill that would make small improvements to the CalCAP ADA Program to make it more attractive and affordable to borrowers.

Ms. Webster-Hawkins continued that SB 551 and AB 964 were converted into two year bills and staff will await next year to see what becomes of those.

Ms. Webster-Hawkins had one item to report under her delegated authority. On September 12, 2017 Ms. Webster-Hawkins approved a Pacific Gas & Electric Company request to appoint TD Bank as a remarketing agent on its Series 1996 F Bonds.

Ms. Webster-Hawkins had a couple of personnel items that she announced. Ms. Webster-Hawkins welcomed two new members to the administrative team, Nick Montalvo and Susanna Tator. These two have come on board and have joined our team with passion and skill and we are very thankful for them coming to us.

The last personnel item that Ms. Webster-Hawkins wanted to acknowledge was the occasion of Mr. Alan Gordon's retirement. She noted that Mr. Gordon has been with us actively in CPCFA since the first meeting in 2011 where he served as the delegate for the State Controller. He has been a great mentor and a great ambassador for CPCFA's programs, in particular, that he understands each of CPCFA's programs and where they fit in the economic marketplace and how they help environmental and economic projects. She thanked him for his service to us and congratulated him on his retirement.

Renewable Sonoma LLC and/or its Affiliates, #913(SB*), Solid Waste Disposal, \$29,630,000

 Alameda County Industries, Inc. and/or its Affiliates, #912(SB*), Solid Waste Disposal, \$12,205,000 total issuance, Volume Cap Allocation of \$12,205,000 and SBAF assistance of \$37,080

Alameda County Industries, Inc. and/or its Affiliates requested approval of a Final Resolution and Volume Cap Allocation for an amount not to exceed \$12,205,000 and a Small Business Assistance Fund Resolution not to exceed \$37,080 to finance improvements to an existing Materials Recovery Facility (MRF) and the acquisition of related equipment for the processing, transfer and recycling of waste, such as compressed natural gas vehicles. The company anticipated that the project will provide waste diversion, air quality, water quality and recycling benefits.

Staff introduced Neil Black of California Bioenergy LLC, Jason Grubbs of The Frazer Lanier Company, and Leslie M. Lava, Law Offices of Leslie M. Lava.

ABEC Holdco I, LLC, ABEC #3, LLC dba Lakeview Dairy Biogas, California Bioenergy LLC and/or their Affiliates requested approval of a Final Resolution to issue revenue notes, Volume Cap Allocation for an amount not to exceed \$1,373,000 to finance the acquisition and construction of an anaerobic dairy digester and assistance from SBAF in an amount not to exceed \$151,968 for costs of issuance assistance.

Ms. Ortega moved approval of the item; there was a second.

Mr. Gordon asked if there were any questions or comments from the Board or public.

Ms. Webster-Hawkins stated that the project's leadership under Mr. Black and his colleague Mr. Buckingham who have been working tirelessly for many years in the area of biogas production, increasing the demand and economic feasibility of these facilities on agricultural lands and the fact that Mr. Black was sitting before us today is a testament to his perseverance and vision.

Ms. Webster Hawkins thanked Mr. Black for his leadership in the environmental space.

Mr. Black expressed his thanks for the comments and offered a tour for anyone present should they be near the Bakersfield facility to see what has been built.

Mr. Gordon asked if the facility had the large confined animal lots that are commonly seen in the northern parts of California.

Mr. Black clarified that yes the facilities are large dairies.
