Introduction

Pursuant to California Education Code (EC) 47614.5(h), the California School Finance Authority (CSFA or Authority) is required to present fund details of the Charter School Facility Grant Program (Program) each fiscal year. Given the nature of the Program's funding cycle, CSFA is reporting on the Program updates and highlights for the 2020-21 Funding Round as disbursements for each Funding Round are often made across fiscal years.

Program Background

Senate Bill 740, authored by Senator Jack O'Connell in 2002, established the Charter School Facility Grant Program (Program). Given that Senate Bill 740 created the Program, it is commonly referred to as the "SB740 Program," as well as the Charter School Facility Grant Program. From its enactment in 2002 through 2012-13, the California Department of Education (CDE) administered the Program. In the Governor's 2013-14 Budget, the Program's administration was transferred from CDE to the Authority. The Program provides grants to offset annual on-going facility costs for charter schools serving a high percentage of students eligible for free or reduced-price meals (FRPM) or for charter schools located within a public elementary school boundary that meets the FRPM threshold.

Prior to the 2016-17 Funding Round, the Program was typically undersubscribed, which resulted in the Authority not awarding the entire annual apportionment. Subsequently, the California Department of Finance (DOF) implemented a significant programmatic change and reduced the FRPM program eligibility threshold from 70% to 55%. Since this change went into effect, the number of Program applicants, along with the percentage of funding disbursed, has steadily risen. The chart below provides historical information related to Program apportionments, amounts awarded to schools, the number of applicants as well as the percentage of funding disbursed to schools.

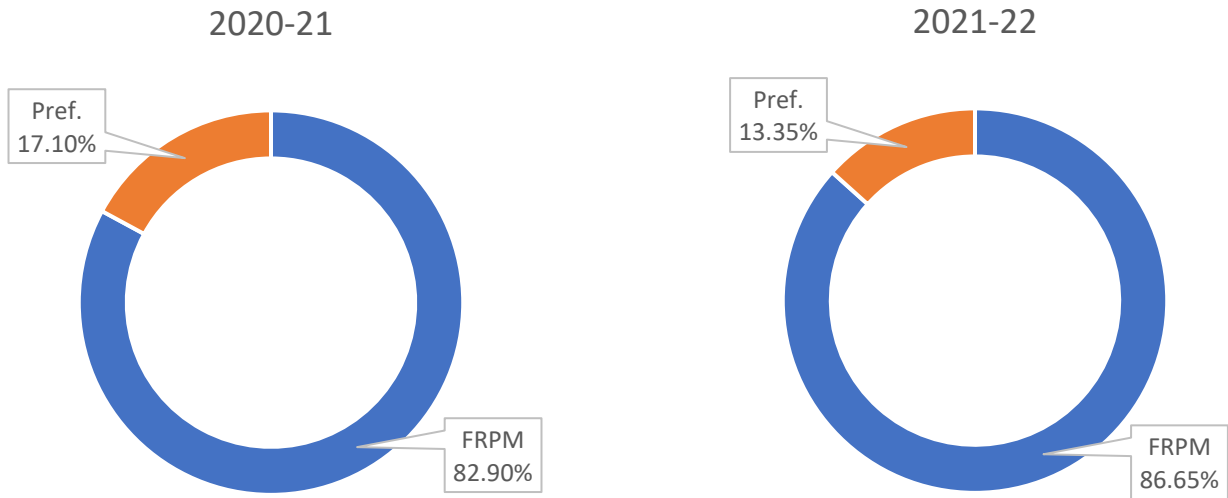

2021-22 Program Award Breakdown

In the 2021-22 Funding Round, the Authority awarded funds to 422 of the 427 eligible awardees. There were five eligible schools that did not have eligible rent or lease costs and therefore did not receive any funding (discussed in detail in section "2021-22 Over-subscription" below). Additionally, there were eight applicants deemed ineligible due to FRPM below 55% and lacked the ability to rely on a preference in admissions policy.

Most applicants, 368 or 86.59%, had a pupil population with an FRPM percentage of at least 55%. Only 13.41%, or 57 applicants, relied on a local elementary school's FRPM percentage to receive funding. This is increase

from 2020-21, as 349 applicants, or 82.90%, had a pupil population with a percentage of at least 55%, and 72 applicants, or 17.10%, relied on a local elementary schools FRPM percentage to receive funding.



The average award would have been \$341,754 if the Authority had the funding to provide 100% of lease/rent-based awards. This is a 2.05% decrease over the average lease/rent-based awards in the 2021-22 Funding Round, which was \$348,911 if 100% funding were available. Due to the oversubscription, the Authority pro-rated lease/rent awards at 97.37%, which resulted in an average award amount of \$325,660. This is a slight increase of 0.75% increase from the pro-rata awards in the 2020-21 Funding Round which was 323,226.

There also was a shift in award caps in 2021-22; awards are either 75% of reimbursable rent amounts or the average daily attendance (ADA) multiplied by \$1,232, whichever is less. In 2021-22, 164 applicant’s awards were capped by their ADA, this is a 23.36% decrease from 2020-21’s total ADA-capped applicants of 214. Conversely, rent/lease capped awards increased in 2021-22 to 261, 24.88% from 2020-21’s total of 209. This is likely due to rent and lease costs increasing at a higher rate than the ADA cap per student, which is based on the annual Cost-of-Living-Adjustment (COLA).

Foster Youth and Homeless

As the Program is designed to provide funding to schools serving socioeconomically disadvantaged students, many of the schools in the program serve Foster Youth and pupils considered Homeless. In 2021-22, there were roughly 672,130 students enrolled in grades K-12 in public charter schools compared to 690,150 students in 2020-21. Of those 672,130 students, 2,515 were estimated to be foster youth and 12,530 were considered homeless. In 2021-22, SB740 awardees served 30.89% of all foster youth enrolled at charter schools, these 753 students make up 0.39% of all students enrolled with SB740 awardees, which is comparable to the 0.37% all non SB740 charter schools serve.

The Program also serves a sizeable portion of the pupils considered homeless. In 2021-22 SB740 awardees served 3,710 students considered homeless which is 29.61% of the approximately 12,530 pupils considered homeless enrolled in charter schools across the state. These students served by SB740 awardees represent

1.92% of total enrollment of SB740 awardees and is also comparable to the percentage non SB740 charter school with 1.84%.

Most awardees serve a percentage of foster youths and/or pupils considered homeless at about 85.31%, or about 360 of the 422 awardees. The total award for these 360 awardees is nearly \$127,835,200, which is 88.01% of the Program's total apportionment, which is an increase from 2020-21 with 344 awardees at nearly \$119,800,000, or 87.60%, of the Program's total apportionment.

English Learners

More than 106,750 students, or about 15.90%, enrolled in California public charter schools are considered English Learners (EL Students). In 2021-22, SB740 awardees served 46.12% of the state's EL Students enrolled in public charter schools with a total of 49,295. These students represent 25.47% of all students enrolled with awardees, which is more than double the 12.03% of non SB740 charter school awardees.

Most awardees serve a percentage of EL Students. The total award for these 419 of 422 awardees is approximately \$141,173,500, which is 97.20% of the Program's total apportionment. The average percentage of EL Students for SB740 awardees is 24.88%, with the highest being 89.79%. 51 awardees also serve a percentage of at least 50%.

Funding per County

SB740 funds numerous schools in a majority of California counties; in 2021-22, SB740 funded 658 different facilities operated by 422 schools serving more than 153,000 students. Of the 58 counties in California, SB740 awardees are located in 28 counties. The average county has 7.6 awardees with 12 facilities and serving an ADA of approximately 2,800 with the average total funding per county is \$2,454,473. The average awardee per county received about \$293,097 in funds and \$226,641 per facility. Lastly, the average award per student is roughly \$901, lower than the program ADA maximum of \$1,232.

Los Angeles County received the greatest total of awarded funds at \$34,062,925; had the largest ADA with 38,141; most awardees with 104 awardees; and most facilities with 128 facilities. Imperial, Inyo, and Yolo Counties have the highest average of dollar amount per student at \$1,215. Solano County has the highest average award per awardee and per facility at \$809,341. Excluding Solano County which only had one awardee with one facility, Sacramento County has the highest average award per awardee at \$614,348 and Kern County has the highest average award per facility at \$576,411. Comprehensive details are provided in Table 3 below.

2021-22 Over-subscription

As was the case since the 2020-21 Funding Round, SB740 was oversubscribed to the point where rent/lease-based awards had to be pro-rated; the shortfall in funding for rent/lease-based awards of \$3,725,574 left no funding available for other facility related costs. Therefore, school applicants were not able to submit other costs due to the oversubscription since the 2018-19 Funding Round.

Oversubscription led to additional funding delays, as all award amounts are interconnected. Any change in one award amount results in numerous, if not all, award amounts changing.

Regulation Changes

There were no regulatory changes made during the 2021-22 funding round.

Related Legislative Actions

As the Program is annually allocated, California's annual budget act provides positions and allocations proposed by the Governor, Department of Finance, and the Authority which is then approved by the State Legislature through Assembly Bill 128 (Ting (D) – 19). For the 2021-22 Funding Round, the Legislature approved \$141,520,000 for local assistance, i.e., program awards. There were two major changes to the programs funding allocation from last funding round. An increase of \$728,000 ongoing Proposition 98 General Fund to support a 1.70 percent cost-of-living adjustment for the Program; and an increase of \$6,006,000 ongoing Proposition 98 General Fund to support revised estimates of eligible costs for the Program.

The Program was the subject of Assembly Bill 2484 (Bonta (D) – 18). This bill was sponsored by the California School Employees Association (CSEA). The Authority and State's Treasurer's Office originally worked with the Author's office and Sponsor to address the concerns that informed many aspects of the proposed bill. Assembly Bill 2484 passed the Assembly floor but did not pass through the Senate. Complexities, concerns, and other variables led to its inability to move beyond the Senate Appropriation Committee.

Furthermore, there was a Joint Legislative Audit Committee (JLAC) request associated with Assembly Bill 2484. JLAC is a 14-member committee consisting of seven Assembly Members and seven State Senators. The Chair of the Committee is a member of the Assembly and the Vice Chair a member of the Senate. The details of the JLAC audit are provided in the next section. It should be noted that the audit findings were not finalized until February 2023 and did not affect the 2021-22 Program Funding Round.

California State Auditor Report

As stated above, two programs administered by the Authority were subject to a JLAC audit in 2022. This request was submitted by Assembly Member Bonta, CSEA, and Assembly Member O'Donnell, who has since termed out of office. The initial request and scope are provided in Appendix D. This request was approved in July 2022

by a vote of 8 to 4. The Audit focused on both the Authority's oversight of the Program as well as the Authority's Conduit Revenue Bond Program. The scope for the Program included the 2021-22 Funding Round.

The Audit report officially concluded in February 2023 with Report 2022-110. The California State Auditor determined that both programs are generally achieving their purpose of increasing charter schools' access to facility funding and CSFA generally administers both programs with fidelity to the state laws that created them. Furthermore, according to the Audit, the Program provides state funding to subsidize charter schools' facilities rent and lease costs and most of the recipient schools enroll a sizeable percentage of students from socio-economically disadvantaged communities. The Report also found that charter schools that received program funding closed half as often than other charter schools. Additionally, the report found the schools selected for review were often located in areas needing additional classroom space. Lastly, there were no findings or items of concerns related to the 2021-22 Funding Round. The Authority is currently working with State Auditor on post-Audit compliance and the implementation of Audit recommendations. Moreover, the Authority has continued its efforts and dialogues with Assembly Member Bonta and CSEA related to next actions. The 2022-23 Annual Funding Report will provide great insight as much of the Audit work was performed during that round.

Conclusion

Oversubscription, per staff projections, has been and will continue to be an ongoing issue if program appropriations remain below lease projections. The Program has been under-subscribed under the California Department of Education's administration, and since 2013, when the Program was transferred to the Authority's administration, funding levels have allowed for full lease/rent costs. It should be noted that the Authority is hopeful for the 2022-23 Funding Round, but not certain. This lack of funding causes administrative issue beyond the inability to provide funding as the Program is intended to do.

Oversubscription's main effect is the interconnectivity of awards. Best practice is for the Authority to ensure all awardees receive the same percentage, or factor, of their eligible award amount. In previous rounds, the Authority had the ability to authorize all awards that were already capped at their ADA levels, as well as schools with other costs, while holding back funds for any awards related to applicants appealing and/or working on eligibility requirements. This was not the case for the 2021-22 Funding Round, as all final awards must be authorized at the same time to ensure all awardees receive the same award percentage.
