

CalABLE Presentations Evaluation Summary 2019

CalABLE’s Executive Director, Dante Allen and Deputy Executive Director, Carrie Fisher Stone presented to a mix of stakeholders, parents of potential beneficiaries, potential beneficiaries, and providers on March 6, March 18, March 19, March 27, April 17, April 22, and May 9. One hundred ninety-nine evaluation forms were collected in total. There were twelve questions left unanswered. The average ratings from the answers to the questions related to the content of the presentation are given in the summary below.

The analysis of the answers given on the evaluation forms confirms the impression left during the presentation. Overall, the presentation was well rated. Attendees provided written feedback with statements such as very helpful and appreciated the use of plain language; a great resource for people I work with; and informative and clear. The more appreciated aspects of the presentation were: presenter exhibited a good understanding of topic (100% rating of 4 or above out of 5) and presenter spoke clearly and effectively (100% rating of 4 or above out of 5).

While more than half (67%) of respondents reported that the presentation was done in a way that engaged the audience, nearly one-third (31%) of them rated it as either Very Good or Good, and less than five people rated it as Very Poor.

Overall, attendees shared that they most appreciate the presenters’ personal experiences with either having a disability or parenting someone who does.
