### NOTIFICATION OF PROPOSED EMERGENCY REGULATION READOPTION ACTION

#### California Achieving a Better Life Experience (ABLE) Program Trust Regulations

The California Achieving a Better Life Experience (ABLE) Act Board is proposing to readopt emergency regulations affecting qualified people with disabilities. The regulations are proposed for readoption into California Code of Regulations, Title 10, Chapter 14.

Government code section 11346.1(a)(2) requires that, at least five working days prior to submission of the proposed emergency action to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL), the adopting agency provide a notice of proposed emergency action to every person who has filed a request for notice of regulation action with the agency. After submission of the proposed emergency regulations to the OAL, OAL shall allow interested persons five calendar days to submit comments on the proposed regulations as set forth in Government Code section 11349.6.

The California ABLE Act Board is hereby notifying you of its intent to resubmit the California ABLE Program Trust emergency regulations to the OAL in the next five working days or more. These emergency regulations were first adopted effective February 21, 2017 and unless readopted, will lapse on August 22, 2017. The Request for Readoption of these regulations will extend the effective date of these emergency regulations for an additional 90 days thus ensuring that there will not be a gap in the effectiveness of the emergency regulations. The readoption will also provide the Board the time necessary to make these emergency regulations permanent.

No changes have been made to the proposed regulations and the emergency circumstances are unchanged since the initial emergency rule adoption.
