

November 2023 Summary of Program Changes for Contractors

GoGreen Home Energy Financing

Program Expansion — GoGreen Home Financing for All Measures Now Available to City of Palo Alto Utilities Customers

In October 2023, CAEATFA entered into a partnership with the City of Palo Alto Utilities (CPAU), an energy utility providing gas and electricity to the residents of the City of Palo Alto. **Through this collaboration, GoGreen Home contractors can offer GoGreen Home financing for heat pumps and other Eligible Energy Efficiency Measures (EEEMs) to CPAU customers.**

CPAU customers were previously ineligible for GoGreen Financing because they didn't receive fuel from an Investor-Owned Utility (IOU) like PG&E, SoCalGas, SoCal Edison, or San Diego Gas and Electric (SDG&E).

All other <u>GoGreen Home eligibility rules</u> apply, and there is no change in the process of submitting a project to a Lender.

New Eligibility Rules for the Cool Roof

Starting November 4th, GoGreen Home lenders will no longer approve Cool Roof financing projects in electric publicly owned utility (POU) territories such as SMUD, LADWP, City of Roseville, City of Glendale, etc. View a <u>full list of POUs</u>.

You can still offer GoGreen Home financing for Cool Roof projects where the property receives electricity from PG&E, SoCal Edison, or SDG&E utilities. Together these utilities provide electricity to roughly 4 out of 5 Californians.

We apologize for any inconvenience. Rules pertaining to GoGreen Financing funding have changed, and we have had to adjust eligibility accordingly.
