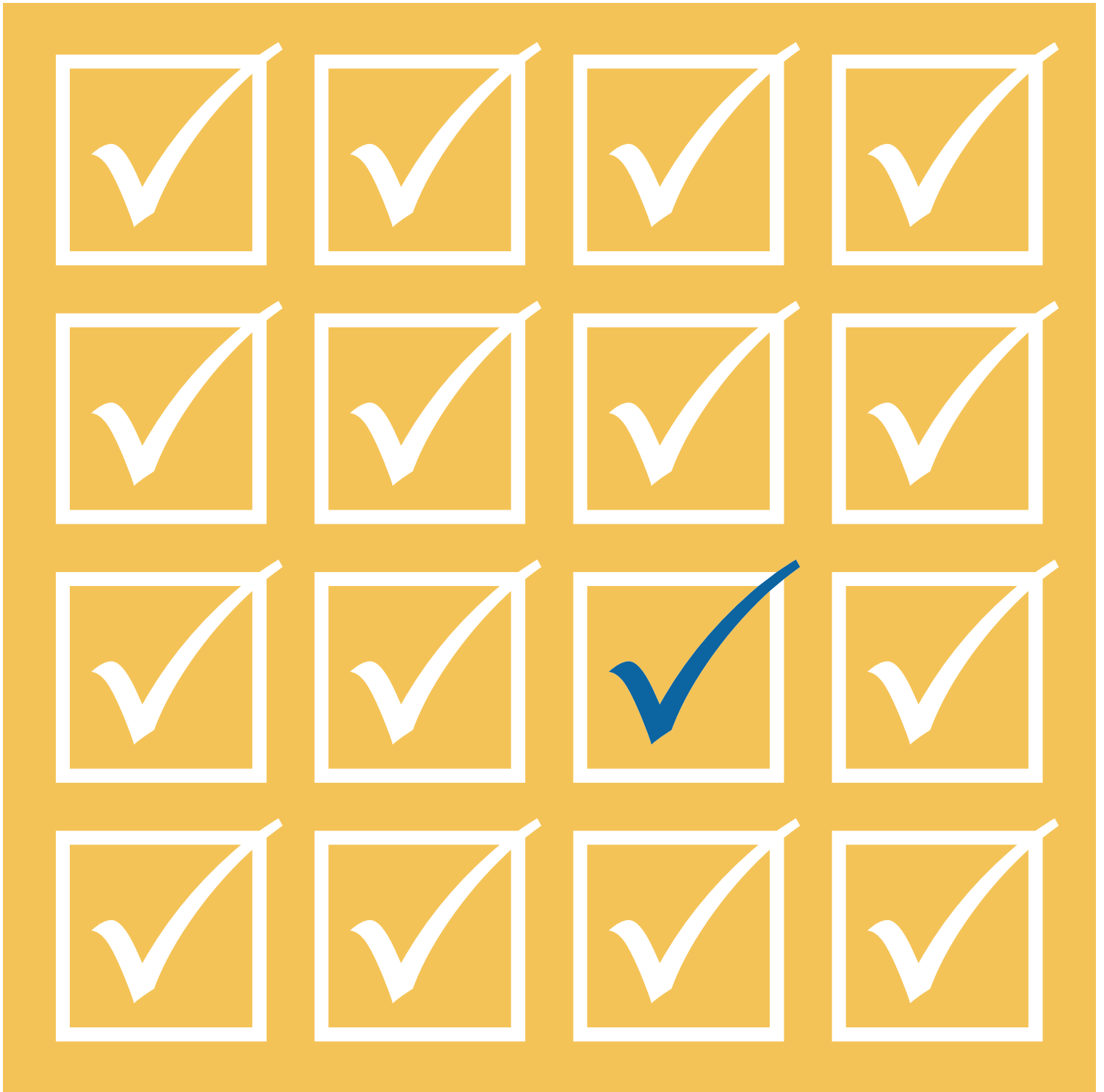

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INTRODUCTION

Constitutional and statutory provisions require voters to authorize general obligation (GO) bonds issued by state and local governments. For GO bonds issued by the state, the authorization must be made through a statewide election. Local GO bonds must be approved by voters within the jurisdiction authorizing the bond. The State and local governments must also seek voter approval for levies of general and special taxes. For both State and local measures, the voter approval threshold depends on the type and purpose of the bond or tax (see Figure 1).

After each statewide election, CDIAC publishes a statistical summary and review of bond and tax measures appearing on state and local ballots. This report, the 25th in the series, summarizes the results of bond and tax measures on the November 2nd, 2010 General Election.

In addition, it will also include a side-by-side comparison of the 2008 and 2010 general elections. It also contains appendices which summarize the measures by county, region, type of tax/debt and purpose.

NOVEMBER 2010 GENERAL ELECTION RESULTS

- **TOTAL MEASURES.** Voters considered 195 measures, including 194 local measures and one state fiscal measure.
- **APPROVED MEASURES.** Voters approved 116 (60 percent) of the measures: 49 bond measures, 17 special tax or fee measures and 50 general governmental tax or fee measures.
- **PASSAGE RATES.** Local bond measures had the highest passage rate (73 percent), and special taxes or fees had the lowest passage rate (34 percent).

GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND MEASURES

- **STRONG SUPPORT FOR GO BOND MEASURES.** Voters approved 73 percent.
- **VOLUME OF APPROVED MEASURES.** Voters approved \$4.2 billion in GO Bond Measures.
- **EDUCATIONAL FOCUS.** 94 percent of the GO bond measures were for K-12 education and community colleges.
- **STRONG SUPPORT FOR EDUCATIONAL GO BONDS.** Voters approved 75 percent.

Figure 3 summarizes the election results by number and volume.

Figure 4 summarizes the election results by type of measure. As noted in the introduction, two-third voter approval is needed for GO bonds and 55 percent for education GO bonds. There was one exception in which a non-education GO bond measure required a majority. This measure raised the authorized debt limit on a GO bond that was approved in 2002.

GENERAL AND SPECIAL TAX MEASURES

- **SUPPORT FOR TAX MEASURES.** There was moderate support for tax measures. Voters approved 52 percent of such measures.
- **SUPPORT FOR GENERAL GOVERNMENTAL TAX MEASURES.** General governmental mea-

asures were relatively well supported (64 percent passage rate).

- **MAJORITY VS. TWO-THIRDS VOTING REQUIREMENT.** It should be noted that the general governmental measures only needed a majority of the vote to pass. If these measures had a two-thirds vote requirement, only 46 percent would have passed.
- **MAJORITY VS. TWO-THIRDS VOTING REQUIREMENT.** In contrast, special measures, which require two-third voter approval to pass, were weakly supported (34 percent passage rate). If these measures required a majority vote, 78 percent of these measures would have passed.
- **PURPOSE OF TAXES.** The majority of tax measures were for general government (61 percent). Most of the remaining tax measures were for public health & safety and education.

- **PASSAGE RATES.** The passage rates were highest for tax measures for general government (64 percent). K-12 education tax measures had the lowest passage rates (12 percent).

Figure 5 summarizes the election results by type of tax. One of these measures was a special state tax measure (see text box at right).

Figure 6 shows the passage rates for special tax measures and general tax measures at the majority voting threshold and at a two-third voter threshold. It contrasts the actual results at the existing voting requirement with results of a theoretical voting requirement.

Figure 7 shows tax measures by purpose and the passage rate in each category.

BOND AND TAX MEASURE RESULTS BY REGION

- **APPROVED MEASURES.** Bay Area Region voters approved the most measures (63). San Diego/Inland Empire Region voters approved the least number of measures (9).
- **PASSAGE RATES.** The Bay Area Region also had the highest passage for GO bond and tax measures (68.5%). The Central Valley had the lowest passage rate (42.4%).

The election results can also be reviewed for regional differences. Staff divided the results into the five regions detailed in Figure 9.

Figure 8 shows the number and percentage of measures that were approved by region.

STATE PROPOSITION 21 TAX MEASURE SUMMARY

This measure would have created an \$18 dollar vehicle license surcharge to provide funds for the operation and maintenance of California state parks and wildlife protection programs. This fee would have provided an estimated \$250 million dollar annual increase in revenues for state parks and wildlife preservation. The measure failed by a margin of 58 percent to 42 percent. COMPARISON OF THE 2008 AND 2010 GENERAL ELECTIONS

AN INTERESTING MATCHUP

- **COMPARATIVE PASSAGE RATES.** The passage rate of bond and tax measures during the 2008 general election (76 percent) was considerably higher than that of the 2010 general election passage rate (60 percent).
- **COMPARATIVE NUMBER OF APPROVED MEASURES.** The number of approved measures in 2008 (175) was also significantly higher than the number of approved measures in 2010 (116).
- **GO BOND MEASURE PASSAGE RATES.** GO bond measures had the highest passage rates in both the 2008 and 2010 general election.
- **SPECIAL TAX MEASURE PASSAGE RATES.** Special tax measures had the lowest passage rates in both elections.
- **REGIONAL PASSAGE RATES.** In both elections, the Bay Area region had the highest passage rates, and the Central Valley had the lowest passage rates. Nonetheless, in the 2010 election there was a significant decline in passage rates in every region.

- **PASSAGE RATES BY PURPOSE.** In 2008, education measures had the highest passage rate. In 2010, general governmental measures had the highest passage rate.
- **COMPARATIVE NUMBER OF PROPOSED LOCAL MEASURES.** In both elections, the highest percentage of proposed local measures was for educational use. The lowest percentage of proposed local measures was for capital improvements.

Figure 10 provides a breakdown of the passage requirement for the bond and tax measures appearing on the 2008 General Election and the 2010 General Election ballots.

Figure 11 provides a breakdown of the types of bond and tax measures on the general election ballots.

A summary of votes by regions is provided in Figure 12. The 58 counties have been categorized into five different regions (see Figure 9). A few of the measures that appeared on the ballots in the other region category spanned more than one county.

Figure 13 summarizes the types of projects appearing on the General Election ballots. Projects that comprise the miscellaneous category include the following: alternative energy, beach/coastal maintenance, parks/recreation, swimming pools, housing, lockable mailboxes, libraries, a mosquito abatement program, open space/clean water/farmland protection, public employees' retirement, tourism, water, flood control, natural resources, conservation projects, athletic facilities, gang prevention programs, public transit services, road improvements, health facilities, and storm water systems.

SUMMARY

There has been a significant decline in the passage rate of bond and tax measures from the 2008 General Election to the 2010 General Election: from 76 percent to 60 percent. In addition, there has been a pronounced drop in the number of approved measures: 175 to 116.

However, there has been some consistency between the elections. In the 2008 and the 2010 elections, GO bond measures had the highest passage rates and special tax measures had the lowest passage rates. In addition, in both elections, the highest percentage of proposed local measures was for educational use, and the lowest percentage of proposed local measures was for capital improvements.
