Past Performance:

The application indicates the applicant met the 2009 minimum performance requirement that at least **40%** of the program participants are lower-income households or located in a Qualified Census Tract.

The application indicates the applicant expects to meet the 2010 minimum performance requirement that at least **40%** of program participants will be lower-income households.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the Committee approve an amount of \$4,869,455 in tax-exempt bond allocation to the County of San Mateo for the Mortgage Credit Certificate Program. This is the Applicant's 2010 fair share amount.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED PROGRAM:

- **Population to be served by the proposed Program (family size, income levels, etc.):**
According to the Applicant, the proposed Program expects to serve all ethnic groups and family sizes with a minimum of 40% of the households at or below 80% of the median income adjusted by household size.
- **Estimated number of first-time homebuyers to be assisted:** 26
- **Housing stock to be purchased (types, unit sizes, etc):**
According to the Applicant, the housing stock to be purchased will consist of mostly if not all 1 and 2 bedroom condominiums with purchase prices ranging from \$300,000 to \$500,000.
- **Specific reservations of MCCs for purposes such as low-income targeting, new construction, etc.:**
According to the Applicant, the program will reserve 40% of the MCCs for families with incomes at or below 80% of the area median income adjusted for family size.
- **Expected duration MCCs will be available and anticipated monthly rate of issuance.:**
According to the Applicant, MCCs are expected to be available for 13 months and the anticipated monthly rate of issuance is 2 MCCs per month.
- **Other homebuyers assistance programs offered by participating jurisdiction(s):**
According to the Applicant, homebuyer down payment assistance programs are currently available from San Mateo County as well as the cities of Foster City, Menlo Park, Millbrae, San Bruno, San Carlos, South San Francisco and San Mateo County Community College District. The Applicant states that all down payment assistance programs offered can be used in conjunction with the MCC program. In addition, the County, Foster City and Menlo Park are participants in the California Housing Finance Agency (CalHFA) Affordable Housing Partnership Program (AHPP).
