CCC to HBCU Transfer Guarantee Agreement

Students must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Complete 30 or more transferable credits or an associate degree for transfer (ADT)
- Attend a California Community College
- Have a minimum GPA of 2.0*

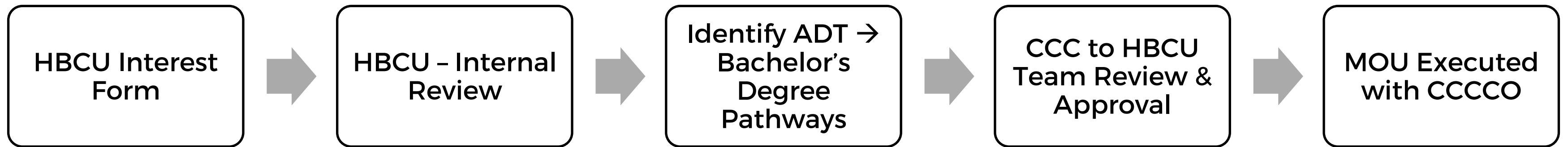


Benefits:

- Guaranteed admission to a partner HBCU
- Priority consideration for housing
- Pre-transfer advisement
- Scholarship and grant opportunities
- Support from application → graduation



CCC to HBCU Transfer Guarantee Agreement – HBCU Eligibility



Cal-HBCU Student Eligibility Requirements



To be eligible for the Cal-HBCU Program, students must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- 01 Complete an associate degree for transfer (ADT) from a California Community College
- 02 Demonstrate unmet financial need
- 03 Enroll (or plan to enroll) at an eligible HBCU
- 04 Intend to return to California after graduating from the eligible HBCU.

The list of eligible HBCUs is available online csac.ca.gov/cal-hbcu and will be updated as needed.

Student Communication



Award Notification:

After the HBCU Financial Aid Office has provided unmet financial need, student will receive an award notification with their award amount and an estimated timeframe for their school to receive the check.

Mailed Notification:

Once the State Controller's Office has mailed student's check to the Commission, student will receive an alert that the check was mailed to their financial aid office.

Denial Notification:

If the student is ineligible for the Cal-HBCU Program, the student will receive a denial notification including the reason for their ineligibility.

HBCU Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for the Cal-HBCU Program, the HBCU must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- 01 Have an associate degree for transfer memorandum of understanding on file with the CCC HBCU Transfer Agreement Program.
- 02 Have Cohort Default Rate of **LESS than 15.5%**
Have Graduation Rate of **MORE than 30%**
- 03 Are regionally accredited by an agency recognized by the United States Department of Education.

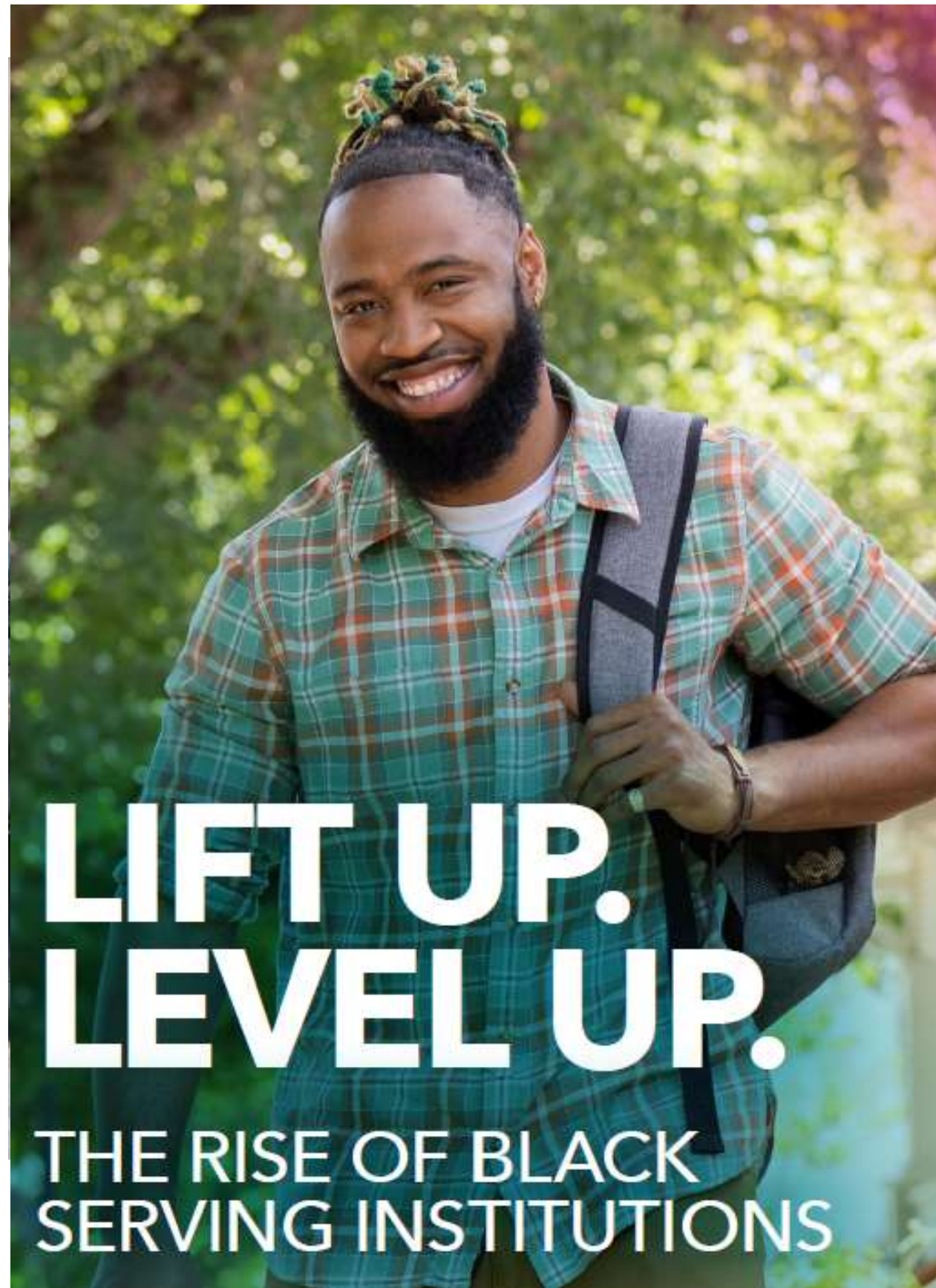
