



Community Services Infrastructure Grant Program

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Chapter 33, Statutes of 2016 (SB 843), Section 52, established the Community Services Infrastructure Grant Program (CSI Grant Program) intended to improve access to jail diversion programs. SB 843 provides a mechanism for funding a statewide expansion of mental health treatment, substance use disorder treatment, and trauma-centered services via grants available to counties. The California Health Facilities Financing Authority (CHFFA) was assigned the responsibility for developing the program as well as awarding and administering the grants.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

Counties and counties applying jointly are eligible applicants for the CSI Grant Program.

ELIGIBLE COSTS

- ❖ Facility Acquisition
- ❖ Information Technology
- ❖ Renovation
- ❖ Three Months Start-Up
- ❖ Furnishings/Equipment

PROGRAM FUNDING

The CSI Grant Program was allocated \$65,813,000 in a one-time appropriation to fund grant projects. All grant funding was awarded over two funding rounds for 16 projects in 10 counties. The following counties have received CSI grant awards: Contra Costa, Los Angeles, Nevada, Riverside, Sacramento, San Joaquin, San Luis Obispo, Solano, Sonoma, and Yolo.

GRANT ENCUMBRANCE AND DISBURSEMENT DEADLINES

Deadlines for grant funds to be encumbered (awarded) and expended (disbursed) were set by the Legislature. All grant funds must be disbursed and all programs must be open and operational by June 30, 2022.
