# Item #2 County of Mendocino (Third Funding Round), Investment in Mental Health Wellness Grant Program, Resolution No. MH 2015-03B

Nicole Weaver, staff analyst presented. Ms. Weaver requested Authority approval to set a cure period of 30 calendar days, effective October 8, 2019 and ending on November 8, 2019, for the County of Mendocino ("County"). This approval will allow the County to cure its event of default. The County missed its milestone condition of securing funding sufficient to complete a Crisis Residential Treatment ("CRT") project by September 30, 2019. Therefore, the County is in default of its grant agreement with the Authority.

Attendees: Dr. Jenine Miller, Director and Karen Lovato, Acting Deputy Director, Behavioral Health and Recovery Services.

Ms. Lovato gave an overview of the history, need, and wide community support of the CRT project.

Dr. Miller discussed the crisis and recovery mode during the fires that occurred in the county. As a result of the fire recovery efforts, there was a delay in the county securing sufficient funding for the CRT project.

Dr. Miller went on to discuss the November 2017 passage of Measure B, which would pay for construction and staffing of mental health treatment services within the county. The CRT project is the county's first priority for the use of Measure B funding.

Authority Members discussed a number of possibilities for a cure period and agreed upon 60 calendar days, and that the County would need to appear at the December 5, 2019 Authority meeting, so new milestones may possibly be set by the Authority.

Chair Noda asked if there were any additional questions or public comment; there were none.
