## Summary of Project:

## Mobile Crisis Support Team Program

The County of Riverside (County) plans to expand its existing mobile crisis support program by adding two new Mobile Crisis Support Teams (MCSTs) through the purchase of two new vehicles and the hiring of four new full-time staff that may include a clinical therapist, behavioral health specialists II and III, and a peer support specialist to provide mental health crisis services to children and youth up to 21 years of age and their families/caregivers. The County's existing nine MCSTs provide targeted one-time crisis intervention assessment and limited 60-day phone follow-ups. The new MCSTs will respond to immediate crisis requests and will also provide highly specialized therapeutic, recovery-based, culturally sensitive services and linkage to community resources for three to four months after the initial crisis contact. The new MCSTs will collaborate with multiple systems, including crisis stabilization units, RUHS-BH medical centers, school districts, the Department of Social Services, local and county law enforcement agencies, and the juvenile probation system. The County expects the two new MCSTs will provide crisis mental health services to an additional 75-120 clients per year. Grant funds will be used to purchase two new vehicles, to finance information technology costs, for three months of program startup or expansion costs, and for personnel costs for new staff. Authority staff evaluated the County's plan and has determined that the program is likely feasible and sustainable.

# A RESOLUTION OF THE CALIFORNIA HEALTH FACILITIES FINANCING AUTHORITY APPROVING EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF GRANT FUNDING UNDER THE INVESTMENT IN MENTAL HEALTH WELLNESS GRANT PROGRAM FOR CHILDREN AND YOUTH TO THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE

WHEREAS, The California Health Facilities Financing Authority (the "Authority"), a public instrumentality of the State of California, is authorized by the Investment in Mental Health Wellness Act of 2013 (Welfare and Institutions Code Section 5848.5) as supplemented by Chapter 30, Statutes of 2016 (SB 833), Section 20, the Investment in Mental Health Wellness Grant Program for Children and Youth ("Children and Youth Program") and implementing regulations (California Code of Regulations, Title 4, Division 10, Chapter 7 (commencing with Section 7313)) to award grants for capital funding and personnel funding to finance eligible projects; and

WHEREAS, Authority staff reviewed the application submitted by County of Riverside ("Grantee") against the eligibility requirements of the Children and Youth Program and implementing regulations, and pursuant to the Children and Youth Program and implementing regulations, recommends approval of a grant for the eligible project (the "Project"), which consists of mobile crisis support team capital costs and mobile crisis support team personnel costs, as described in the Grantee's application and as more particularly described in Exhibit A to this Resolution (Exhibit A is hereby incorporated by reference); and

WHEREAS, the Legislature has and may continue to appropriate funds for mobile crisis support team personnel costs in future fiscal years;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the California Health Facilities Financing Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Authority hereby approves a grant for capital costs in the amount of \$73,160.00 to the Grantee to complete the Project within a grant period that ends on August 31, 2022. Within this grant period, Grantee shall provide evidence acceptable to Authority staff demonstrating the Project shall be open and operational on or before February 28, 2022. Funds shall not be disbursed if Grantee is unable to provide evidence acceptable to Authority staff that the Project is on track to be open and operational on or before February 28, 2022. Grantee must submit all capital cost disbursement requests, including required supporting documentation, to the Authority no later than May 31, 2022.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby approves a grant for mobile crisis support team personnel costs in the annual amount of \$321,647.00 for the Project for up to five years. Annual grant amounts subsequent to the initial amount granted are subject to availability of annual budget appropriations by the Legislature. The Executive Director, or the Deputy Executive Director, are hereby authorized and directed, for and on behalf of the Authority, to continue to disburse those funds as may be available under the State Budget Act for each fiscal year.

<u>Section 3.</u> The Executive Director, or the Deputy Executive Director, are hereby authorized and directed, for and on behalf of the Authority, to approve any minor, non-material changes in the Project described in the application submitted to the Authority. Nothing in this Resolution shall be construed to require the Authority to provide additional funding, even if more grants are approved, exceeding available funding. Any notice to the Grantee shall indicate that the Authority shall not be liable to the Grantee in any manner whatsoever should such funding not be available for any reason whatsoever.

<u>Section 4.</u> The Executive Director, or the Deputy Executive Director, are hereby authorized and directed, for and on behalf of the Authority, to disburse funds not to exceed those amounts approved by the Authority for the Grantee. The Executive Director, or the Deputy Executive Director, are further authorized and directed, for and on behalf of the Authority, to execute and deliver to the Grantee any and all documents necessary to complete the disbursement of funds that are consistent with the Children and Youth Program and implementing regulations.

<u>Section 5.</u> The Executive Director, or Deputy Executive Director, are hereby authorized and directed, for and on behalf of the Authority, to do any and all things and to execute and deliver any and all documents which the Executive Director, or the Deputy Executive Director, deems necessary or advisable in order to effectuate the purposes of this Resolution and the transactions contemplated hereby.

<u>Section 6.</u> All funds from this grant must be used in support of the County's mobile crisis support team program for children and youth.
