Quarterly Update

October 26, 2023

The Authority approved a reinstatement of, and an amendment to, Resolution Number MH 2014-06 on February 22, 2018, for an IMHWGP grant for the County of Los Angeles Department of Mental Health (County) in an amount not to exceed \$40,892,700.49 for 240 beds to serve adults in 15 new Crisis Residential Treatment Programs (CRTP); eight new beds in one expanded Crisis Stabilization Unit (CSU), aka Urgent Care Center (UCC); 14 Mobile Crisis Support Teams (MCST) and one clerical staff to provide field-based crisis intervention services to children, adolescents, and adults throughout the County. As a condition of approval, the Authority required the County to provide quarterly updates detailing milestones achieved, progress, and obstacles or challenges related to the completion of the projects.

On April 27, 2023 the Authority approved a seventh amendment to Resolution Number MH 2014-06, granting the County an extension to the open and operational milestone condition to March 31, 2024, as well as extending the grant period and resolution expiration dates to July 31, 2024.

The last update was presented to the Authority on July 27, 2023. The County's 19th quarterly update is summarized on the following pages.

October 2023 QUARTERLY UPDATE

The County reports that the UCC and seven of the 15 CRTPs are open and operational and the remaining eight projects are on track of being open and operational on or before the March 31, 2024 milestone condition deadline. Of the remaining eight CRTPs, five have already obtained Community Care Licensing (CCL) but are not open and operational due to staffing challenges; two are pending CCL licenses and staffing, and one CRTP is still pending execution of the service agreement, CCL license, and staffing.

Below are updates for each facility located on the four campuses throughout Los Angeles County. Please note that a contracted service provider is not allowed to operate more than one facility at each campus. The service providers selected by the County to operate the CRTP facilities are: Telecare, Central Star Behavioral Health, Valley Star Behavioral Health, Stars Behavioral Health, CRTP, Inc. (formerly Bel Air Health Services). One of the CRTPs located at the LAC+USC campus is pending service provider selection. The County selected Pacifica to operate the UCC at the Olive View campus.

LAC+USC Campus (4 CRTPs, 64 beds):

- Telecare: The facility started providing services on December 12, 2022.
- Central Star Behavioral Health: The facility received its CCL license, and the County anticipates the program to be open and operational by October 30, 2023, instead of the previously reported date of August 31, 2023.
- Valley Star Behavioral Health: The facility received its CCL license, and the County anticipates the program to be open and operational by December 18, 2023, instead of the previously reported date of October 31, 2023.
- The fourth service provider withdrew its proposal. The County is expecting to select a new service provider by October 31, 2023, instead of the previously reported date of August 31, 2023; to execute a service provider agreement by December 15, 2023, instead of the previously reported date of September 20, 2023; and to receive licensing and become open and operational by March 31, 2024, instead of the previously reported date of February 28, 2024.

MLK Campus: Mark Ridley-Thomas BHC (1 CRTP, 16 beds):

• Valley Star Behavioral Health: The facility started providing services on February 15, 2023.

Olive View Campus (5 CRTPs, 80 beds) and (1 UCC, 8 beds):

- CRTP:
 - o Telecare: The facility started providing services on December 12, 2022.
 - Central Star Behavioral Health: The facility started providing services on May 17, 2023.

- Valley Star Behavioral Health: The facility received its CCL license, and the County anticipates the program to be open and operational by October 30, 2023, instead of the previously reported date of September 30, 2023.
- Stars Behavioral Health: The facility received its CCL license, and the County anticipates the program to be open and operational by December 18, 2023, instead of the previously reported date of November 30, 2023.
- o CRTP, Inc. (formerly Bel Air Health Services): The service provider agreement was executed on September 1, 2023. The service provider is actively recruiting staff and the County will work with the provider to obtain CCL licensing. The County still anticipates the program to be open and operational by January 31, 2024.

• UCC:

o Pacifica: The facility started providing services on August 22, 2022.

Rancho Los Amigos Campus (5 CRTPs, 80 beds):

- Telecare: The facility started providing services on December 12, 2022.
- Central Star Behavioral Health: The facility started providing services on January 17, 2023.
- Valley Star Behavioral Health: The facility started providing services on June 14, 2023.
- Stars Behavioral Health: The facility received its CCL license, and the County anticipates the program to be open and operational by November 13, 2023, instead of the previously reported date of September 30, 2023.
- CRTP, Inc. (formerly Bel Air Health Services): The service provider agreement was executed on September 1, 2023. The service provider is actively recruiting staff and the County will work with the provider to obtain CCL licensing. The County still anticipates the program to be open and operational by January 31, 2024.
