


# 2018 TCAC/HCD OPPORTUNITY AREA MAP

## Rural-Qualifying Census Tracts (Southern California)


This map displays the distribution of resources for all census tracts statewide that qualify for the TCAC rural set-aside. Tracts were determined to qualify as rural if they are in counties outside of metropolitan areas, if more than 50% of tract population was in a USDA 515 eligible area, or if more than 50% of the tract population was located in a non-metropolitan city with fewer than 40,000 residents. Tracts scores are based on education, economics and mobility, and environmental quality indicators, and are filtered by racial segregation and poverty concentration.
