Implementation Plan Timeline

May-First Review and Discussion of Working Group Progress August-Review and Discussion of Key Plan Items: Eligibility Criteria, Data Sharing & Privacy Plans, Investment Strategy, Core Infrastructure Plan October-Review and Discussion of Full Draft Implementation with Request for Editorial Suggestions

November - Vote on Adoption of the Implementation Plan for Formatting and Printing January - Submission and Socialization of the Implementation Plan in the Legislature



Eligibility & Outreach Work Group

- Enroll all children who meet the criteria as of March 13, 2020: More accounts with less money
- Allow distribution of funds at 18 or earlier with optional delay: More flexibility, need to address security concerns for minors
- → Community partner expectations TBD



Benefits, Challenges, Questions, and Recommendations



Data Sharing & Privacy Work Group

- Foster data through CWS/CMS: 37,576 kids as of April 1, 2020
- → Waiting on number of foster eligible from April 1, 2020 to today
- → 32,843 est. children who meet COVID impact criteria between January 1, 2020, and May 9, 20<mark>22.</mark>
- Possible sources of COVID impcated data: CDCR, CDPH/NAPHSIS, CA vital records, FEMA
- Organized labor in food/agriculture, transportation/logistics, manufacturing, and facilities
- → Community outreach for COVID Impacted kids will be paramount
- > Keep burden of proof re COVID cause, parental relationship, and income at minimum




Funds per Youth & Investment

MR. HOPE TOP

→ \$100 million FY 23 + \$15 million annually starting FY 2024

Benefits, Challenges, Questions, and Recommendations

- → Less start-up and annual operation costs
- → Invest the rest for capital growth and liquidity
- Learning about fund management structures
- > Data about number of eligible youth and ages will inform annual distribution flows
- → Current estimates mean less than \$1,000 per youth
- > Need to grow capital fund for meaningful impact






IN HOPE FOR CA

- → Evaluation: "continuous measurement of outcomes"




