She also helps develop policy related to portfolio assets. The CAEATFA board is scheduled to approve the appointment at their July 28 meeting.

Solich began her career with the STO in 1990 as an analyst for the Local Agency Investment Fund. She has represented three State Treasurers on the governing boards and committees of the California Public Employees’ Retirement System and California State Teachers’ Retirement System.

Solich, 53, was born and raised in Sacramento. She received her bachelor’s degree in Business Administration and MBA from California State University, Sacramento. She lives with her husband, Mark, and her step-daughter, Stephanie, in Sacramento.
