
- The third quarter of 2025 saw Equity markets broadly climb higher as the Fed cut rates for the first time this calendar year. Fixed Income markets broadly rose, in a period where the yield curve declined. Given the risk-on environment, high yield led its US Agg/TIPS counterparts.
- The FOMC cut rates by 25 bps at the September 2025 meeting and again at the October 2025 meeting. Market expectations for an additional rate cut at the December 2025 meeting have fluctuated drastically since the October meeting, with the probability hovering around equal probability of a cut/no-cut.
- The yield curve is no longer inverted due to expectations for further rate cuts.
- Equities broadly saw positive returns over the quarter.
 - Domestically, Small Cap outperformed Large Cap while value outpaced growth.
 - Nuveen Quant Small Cap Equity was the top performing active US equity fund, returning 11.9%, but lagged the Russell 2000 index (12.4%).
 - Emerging Markets Equity outperformed developed peers, MSCI EAFE and S&P 500 Indexes.
 - DFA Emerging Markets trailed its index (MSCI EM) by 1.7%, returning 8.9%.
- Fixed Income markets broadly saw positive returns over the quarter.
 - PIMCO Income was the best active fixed income fund, returning 2.6%.
- 5 of the 12 active managers in the Plan outperformed or matched their benchmark returns.
- All passively managed funds produced results within expectations.







During the Quarter:

- The majority of stock and bond markets delivered positive returns, driven by Federal Reserve interest rate cut expectations, strong demand for artificial intelligence, positive economic growth and solid corporate earnings.
- Small cap US stocks (+12.4%) led the way outperforming all other public markets benefitting from the September interest rate cut, lower future rate expectations, lower relative valuations and an overall resilient US economy.
- Year-to-date, international public markets continue to outperform all other major public markets helped by a weaker US dollar, rate cuts abroad and strong earnings. Emerging Market equities (+10.6% QTD) outpaced both US and developed international markets, driven by optimism around AI and easing trade tensions. Year-to-date, emerging markets have outperformed all other major asset classes (+27.5%) driven by a 41.6% YTD return in China which has also benefitted from investment in artificial intelligence. Developed international equities are close behind up 25.1%YTD.
- Domestic equity (+8.2%) posted strong gains in the quarter, with value stocks outperforming growth stocks with the exception of large cap stocks. Large technology companies and consumer discretionary stocks drove the growth outperformance in large cap stocks.
- Within public fixed income, US Treasury yields continued their decline during the quarter benefitting from softer labor data and a more dovish central bank leading to gains for the Bloomberg Aggregate (+2.0%). Strong risk appetite by investors also led to positive returns in credit markets.
- Federal Reserve Chair Jerome Powell's recent remarks have heightened expectations for additional rate cuts, but they have also reignited concerns about the Fed's independence amid growing political pressures. Looking ahead, markets face several key risks as the Fed works to balance its dual mandate of maintaining stable inflation and unemployment within target levels. Among the most pressing challenges are the potential inflationary impacts of tariffs, the resilience of the U.S. consumer, and the trajectory of corporate earnings growth. Globally, the outlook for China's economy and the evolving dynamics of U.S.-China relations remain critical factors that could shape global economic conditions and overall market sentiment.
- Diversifying asset classes were also positive.
 - REITs were positive (+4.8%).
 - Commodities rose 3.7%.

Tuition Inflation

- Twelve-month CPI decreased in September to 3.0%, below what economists had expected.
 - Elevated inflation could impact participants ability to save.
- College tuition inflation decreased in September from June's print of 2.2% to 1.4%.
- While tuition inflation remains below CPI, the gap between the two has narrowed considerably.
- Over the long-term, college tuition inflation's 20-year average remains above CPI, 3.4% v 2.6%.


Account & Asset Growth

- During the 3rd quarter total college savings assets increased \$21.8 billion, 6/30/25: \$539.9 billion v 9/30/25: \$561.7 billion.
- Direct plans added over 168,000 accounts during the quarter and Adviser plans lost roughly 11,000.
- Direct plans' accounts and assets continue to out pace Advisor plans.
- The split between Direct and Advisors assets is 64%/36%, respectively with accounts being similarly distributed.
- Total college savings year-over-year account growth ticked up from last quarter at 4.2% v 3.5%, respectively.
 - Direct plan account growth increased by one percentage point over the quarter, 6.3% versus 5.3% for the second quarter.
 - Advisor plan account growth was up 0.4% over the same period which improved as compared to last quarter which was up 0.2%.



Median Portfolio Results

- Both age-based and YOE portfolios saw positive results over the quarter while all longer trailing periods remain positive.
- Over the quarter, Direct Age-based portfolios broadly matched or outperformed their Advisor counterparts.
- Direct Age-based portfolios experienced less risk than their Advisor counterparts over the last five years.
- Over the quarter, Direct YOE portfolios broadly matched or outperformed their Advisor counterparts.
- Over the last 5-year period, Advisor YOE portfolios produced better risk adjusted results than their Direct YOE counterparts.

College Tuition Inflation




Size of Market: Assets and Accounts





Size of Market: Account Growth




